Five Colleges Survey Native Customs

JOHANNESBURG, Dec. 15 (CP) — Five South African universities will next month begin one of the most comprehensive and ambitious surveys of the life and customs of the Bantu-speaking peoples ever undertaken in the Union.

The survey will be carried out in the Transkei area of Cape Province and will be made by 42 students — 12 of whom will be non-European.

It has been organized by Sydney Brenner, national research director of the national Union of South Africa Students. The men and women members of the field survey will live in tents and will study the health, housing, education, agricultural methods and tribal culture of Africans in the Transkei.

The work of the expedition will be documented in a film which will be used for educational purposes. Photographs will be taken of every aspect of the expedition's work and these will later be exhibited throughout the Union.

Members of the survey will be divided into a number of branches according to their qualifications. One branch will study the health of the Africans. This will include a socio-medical survey, and clinical laboratory investigations.

The Union department of health has expressed its interest in this aspect of the expedition's activities, and has offered the assistance of its representatives in the Transkei.

Students with agricultural qualifications will devote their time to studying the farming methods of the Africans, and will examine the possibility of encouraging them to adopt anti-erosion measures when tilling the soil.

Sociologists will report on the African's conception of family life, the strength of kinship, and the effects of lobola (an African custom whereby an intending bridegroom "pays" for his bride's cattle). They will also investigate housing problems in the territory.

The National Union of South African Students gives high priority among its research works to African education and one branch will study the degree to which among the peoples of the Transkei. They will also report on indigenous tribal culture. This will involve a careful examination of native folk lore, legends, myths and religious rites and tribal songs and dances.

The expedition is estimated to cost about \$500. This will be met by grant of \$150 from the research department of N. U. S. A. S. and from student funds at the principal universities and colleges.

The Bantu Welfare Trust has made a grant of \$50 to help meet the expenses of the non-European members of the expedition. The universities taking part in the survey are the University of Witwatersrand, Capetown University, Rhodes University college, and the South African Native College, Fort Hare.

LONDON, Dec. 15 (CP) — The first spiked heels to be seen in Britain since the war share prominence with the flat walking shoe in production this winter, with many of the new styles earmarked for export.

Also on display at the Exhibition of Quality Footwear, were designers showed new models, the high-heeled carrying out in various designs, emphasized the arch and the ankle.

Few Platform Soles Platform soles, so prevalent recently, in high-heeled styles have disappeared from all but a few of the latest designs. Their heaviness was not popular with designers seeking an expression of delicacy and femininity.

Crope-soled flat-heeled shoes in suede and calf are back for home and export. Normally-soled walking shoes, with hand-stitched welts, contrast with the heavier mod. These and lighter shoes are being made in Italian skins. A highlight of the show was the variety of design and colour in the high or ankle-length booties or overboots available for export only in the higher lengths.

The very low slipper-type Brevit is still on the market, providing a light walking-shoe flattering to town wear. There is also the new high-backed, hidden heel shoe, where the studee or leather is brought down to the sole of the heel.

The wedge heel still holds prominence in all flat styles and boots, being especially noticeable in all sandal types.

VICTORY CLAIMED BY STRIKERS

ROME, Dec. 13 (Saturday) — (AP) — Rome's 48-hour general strike, the latest battle in the left's "winter offensive" against Premier Alcide de Gasperi's Christian Democratic Government, ended at midnight with both sides loudly claiming victory.

The communist-controlled Chamber of Labor's vote to end the strike, ratified later by assembled delegations from individual unions, came Friday night after thousands of Romans had gone back to work under the protection of club swinging police.

The largest police force assembled in Rome in recent times — 67,000 men — swung their clubs throughout the city Friday, breaking up jeering throngs and enforcing the firm declaration of Interior Minister Mario Scelba that the Government would "protect those who want to work."
