## STRIKING TERROR INTO THE ENEMY IN EAST PRUSSIA

LONDON, Nov. 5.—Professor Bernard Pares, the British government's representative with the Russian headquarters in the field, sends the following report:

"Trustworthy eye-witnesses speak with great enthusiasm of the conduct of the Russian troops on the upper Vistula river, where more serious fighting is to be expected.

"Here again the German heavy artillery commands respect, but the Russian field guns and howitzers are served with remarkable precision and alertness, and meet with great success. The complete confidence of the Russian infantry in the effectiveness of the Russian artillery is a striking and general feature.

"The men are always training in bayonet work which the enemy often avoids. The Russian cavalry has, by different accounts, shown great dash, and has been handled with speed and skill. In raids beyond the river on the enemy's communications Russian cavalry divisions have severely disturbed German forces, taking many prisoners. Large numbers of stragglers have been taken by the Russians.

"A Hungarian division put up good resistance for three days, but then collapsed.

"The population in Southern Poland is in a state of profound distress and the Russians are organizing extensive relief work.

"The Germans compel captured officers to work with the men, and spit at them and drive them about, bare to the waist.

"In East Prussia the German communications are very good. Underground telephones are frequently discovered. Large forces are in close contact here, and the Russian counter-stroke has much impressed the enemy.

"The Polish population shows the greatest alacrity in assisting the Russian troops, both in the country and in the towns. The Russian advance is now much more complete in Southern Poland and is better lined up with the forces in Galicia.

"All this advance tends to secure the Russian position on the northern coast, where any German initiative becomes more hazardous.

"The ordinary fresh yearly Russian contingents man an increase of a half million men.

"The arrangements for the wounded provide, if necessary, for over a million."

LORD FISHER NAMED AS THE BRITISH FIRST SEA LORD.

LONDON, Nov. 5.—The appointment of Lord Fisher, Admiral of the fleet, to succeed Prince Louis of Battenberg as First Sea Lord was announced officially by the Press Bureau.

Fred T. Jane, naval author and journalist, whose intimate acquaintance with naval matters makes his statements authoritative, writing in The Evening Standard, says that under the Fisher naval administration "we may expect a rapid curtailment of the rights of neutrals to come and go as they please in our waters."

"Fithless, remorseless, and relentless," the writer says, "was one of Lord Fisher's war maxims in the old days. We may look for short shift from him for any German captured who has achieved results by using any flag except his own. It will probably be a case of hang first and inquire afterward, and if public opinion or the Cabinet object, let them object.

Mr. Jane suggests that the humanitarian element in the British Cabinet has hitherto interfered in a question like that of mine laying, and he says that Lord Fisher will not permit such interference.

## GERMANS TRAPPED BY THE ALIENS.

NEW YORK, Nov. 5.—The military expert of the New York Times writes:—"The confidence of the Allies in the strength of their position along the Yser river, in Belgium, is shown by the length of time they opposed the Germans along this stream before they turned its waters into the districts prepared for inundation. This use of the river has been planned for years as a method of defence for Belgium against troops invading the country from the west; now it is used for the opposite purpose. If the Allies had feared the German attacks in this district they would have turned loose this flood when they first took up their position along the Yser two weeks ago. Instead of taking this course, the Allies reserved this weapon for the time when its use would produce the greatest effects.

The German crossing of the Yser, accordingly turned out to be a trap. When they had established their hold on the west bank, in spite of great losses in the attack, the Allies turned loose the flood behind them, and cut off their retreat. At the same time the Allies' artillery fire overpowered the German forces that were thus isolated and inflicted heavy losses.

The fighting on the field has been a costly one for the Germans. It seems beyond question that their losses must be double those of the Allies. They have pressed their attacks under particularly unfavorable conditions, while their early repulse lost the chance to even the score, that could only come through inflicting a decisive defeat.
