BIGOTRY AND IGNORANCE.

Bigotry is often the child of ignorance. You seldom find a man with large intellect who is a bigot. It is the man who thinks he knows a great deal, but does not. That man is almost always a bigot.

So I have set before you what I consider to be the causes of bigotry. I have set before you the origin of this great evil. What are some of the beneficial effects? First, of all, it cripples investigation. You are wrong, and I am right, and that ends it.

While each denomination of Christians is to present all the truths of the Bible, it seems to me that God has given to each denomination an especial mission to give particular emphasis to some one doctrine, and so the Calvinistic churches must present the sovereignty of God, and the Arminian churches must present man's free agency.

DAMAGE DONE BY SECTARIANISM. Another great damage done by the sectarianism and bigotry of the church is that it disgusts people with the Christian religion. Now, my friends, the church of God was never intended for a war barracks.

Francis I. so hated the Lutherans that he said that if he thought there was one drop of Lutheran blood in his veins he would puncture them and let that drop out. Just as long as there is so much hostility between denomination and denomination or between one professed Christian and another, so long men will be disgusted with the Christian religion, and says, "If that is religion I want none of it."

Again, bigotry and sectarianism do great damage in the fact that they hinder the triumph of the gospel. Oh, how much wasted ammunition! How many men of splendid intellect have given their whole life to controversial disputes when, if they had given their life to something practical, they might have been vastly useful.

NEW HAVEN, Conn., August 2.—William P. Dillon, of this city, claims to have discovered Capt. Peterson's buried treasure.

During the year 1753 to 1759 Capt. Peterson a retired officer of the British Navy, made quite a record as a bold, bad buccaner.

Mr. Dillon refuses to disclose the exact location of the treasure. He is working at his trade at present, and as soon as he can save the money he will start for his El Dorado.

Dillon says he searched three years before finding the treasure. He found it last September in one of the seven islands of the Maine coast. It was hidden in a rent in the rocks, wedged in by nearly a solid wall of stone. He was unable to reach it, having but a crowbar with him. His money ran out and he returned to New Haven. He is trying to raise money to secure the treasure, and offers \$10,000 inside of a month to anyone who will stake him with \$100 with which to secure the treasure, which he says consists of six barrels of gold bullion and several bags of jewels of fabulous value.

Rare Stones in the Mountains.

PHILLIPSBURG, Aug. 3.—Weygat Mountain one of the Delaware River, just above Phillipsburg, was sold recently by Abraham Sherer, who had worked a soapstone quarry there. I William B. Keat, of Easton Pa., paid \$80,000 for the hill. Within a week Keat sold a half interest for that sum.

The stone is variegated soapstone, used for ornamental building purposes. There are a dozen other varieties in the hill, including onyx, and other fine antique and asbestos. The stone lies between two strata of granite and the deposit has an average width of 500 feet.

Some of the marble has been pronounced by experts to be equal to the Russian, Numidian and Iceland grades. The professors and students of Lafayette College for years have sought geological specimens all around Weygat. Keat was a prospector in the West for years.
