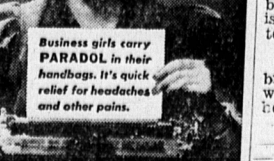

### THE COOK'S CORNER

#### YELLOW TOMATO PRESERVES

6 pounds yellow tomatoes  
2 cups sugar  
4 lemons  
3 tablespoons minced green ginger root  
Method: Blanch tomatoes and remove the skins. Add sugar, grated rind and juice of lemons, and ginger root. Let stand overnight. Cook gently until thickened to a heavy syrup. Pour into sterilized jars and seal at once.

#### VELVET UNCOOKED FONDANT

1 egg white  
2 cups sifted confectioners' sugar  
1-16 teaspoon cream tartar  
2 teaspoons butter or margarine  
2-24 teaspoon vanilla extract  
Blend egg white, confectioners' sugar and cream tartar. Mix thoroughly. Add butter or margarine and vanilla extract. Mix until creamy. Makes 11 ounces.

Chocolate Fondant: Add 2 squares melted unsweetened chocolate and a few drops of water to above recipe. Blend thoroughly.

Chocolate Almond Diamond: Press chocolate fondant between two pieces of waxed paper to 1-8-inch thickness. Repeat, using green almond-colored fondant. Make second chocolate layer. Put layers together, green in centre. Cut in diamond-shapes.

Lemon Logs: Add yellow coloring and oil of lemon to fondant. Form into 1-2 inch cylinders. Roll in yellow sugar. Chill until firm. Dip ends in melted chocolate. Place on waxed paper to harden.

#### MAGIC EASTER EGGS

1-2 cup sweetened condensed milk  
1-2 cup brown sugar  
1 cup confectioners' sugar  
1-2 teaspoon vanilla  
Blend sweetened condensed milk and brown sugar thoroughly. Cook over boiling water 4 minutes or until mixture thickens. Remove from fire, add vanilla and confectioners' sugar gradually. Blend thoroughly. Form into eggs and decorate with candies and fruits. Makes about 30.

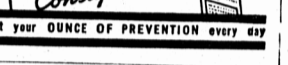

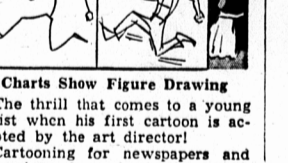
