A FAITHFUL PUBLIC COURSE.

There was something quite pleasingly unique in the leave-taking of Sir Louis Davies as at two public gatherings during last week he announced to hundreds of his supporters his intended retirement from the political arena. It was creditable alike to his head and his heart that he took this method of severing his political relations. Too often the politician retires on the first favorable chance to some office of emolument with little thought or care for the men who have supported him for years and perhaps made him what he is. Sir Louis Davies is of a different stamp. The bond between him and his constituents has been cemented by thirty years of able and brilliant service on his part, and by admiration, love and unshaken fidelity on their part. Their relations are now to sever with mutual regard and esteem.

All must feel that on the political side the retirement of Sir Louis Davies is a public loss—a loss to the party of which he has so long been one of the most resourceful leaders, a loss to Parliament of which he has been so long a distinguished ornament and one of the foremost debaters, a loss to his constituency which cannot hope to replace him with another equally brilliant and able, and a loss to the entire Province of which he has been the tireless, able and successful champion. At the picnic on Saturday, where the retiring Minister was compelled to listen to many flattering eulogies, one speaker remarked that Sir Louis Davies had done more for Prince Edward Island than any man, now living, and more than any other man had ever done. This statement, so heartily applauded at Kingston, sounds a very sweeping one until we seek for the man living or dead for whom a like claim might be set up. Where can he be found? And of what living man in any other Province can the like be said in regard to his services to his own Province?

It is clear that very few of the public men of all Canada have been endowed with such qualifications to win and retain the favor of the people. No one of the public men of Prince Edward Island was ever called to deal with such wide and varied interests at home and abroad, in Ottawa, London and Washington, and in each and all of these Sir Louis has acquitted himself with credit. We doubt not that in the new arena he is now to enter and the new and important duties he is shortly to undertake he will acquit himself equally well and render equally valuable service. The judiciary of Canada and of the Empire has long been the pride of all British subjects. Its functions are of the first importance in the maintenance of justice, of social order and the rights of our common citizenship. Sir Louis' fine talents, legal learning and experience well qualify him for a seat in our highest Court. He will enter it while yet in the prime of life and the fulness of his fame. He will give to his native Island her first representation in that august body, and no one doubts that he will be a just and impartial judge who will ever maintain the purity of the ermine and the high character of the Canadian judiciary.

It is thus gratifying to know that while the Island's favorite and foremost son retires from the political arena his services will not be lost to the Island or to Canada. It was fitting that he should

take leave of his constituents who are hereafter to be his constituents no more. They will still be his friends, admirers and fellow-citizens. The parting is to be made with mutual regard and with becoming dignity. None will grudge Sir Louis the new office and honors that await him. They are the fair reward of his talents, his energy, and his faithful public course. He has not, so far as we know or believe made a single enemy during his long and active political career. This fact will enable all whether in accord or not, with the principles he has espoused in the past, to join in the wish that he may long be spared in health and enjoyment to further serve his country as one of the Judges of the highest Canadian Court.
