### Contract Bridge

#### CUE-BIDDING

Cue-bidding, to show first and even second-round controls, is far more effective than the use of a four-notrump convention in many cases. For example:

South, dealer. North-South vulnerable.

♠ J975 ♠ K6  
♥ K432 ♥ AK432  
♦ 83 ♦ 83

♠ 843 ♠ 10743  
♥ J75 ♥ Q986  
♦ K106 ♦ QJ95

♠ A K Q 102 ♠ 10743

When the deal actually occurred, North-South were using the Blackwood convention, and the bidding proceeded as follows:

South West North East

3♥ Pass 3♠ Pass

4NT Pass 5♥ Pass

5NT Pass 6♠ Pass

6♣ Pass Pass Pass

Obviously, South could not afford to bid the grand slam (which was so very "cold") because he could not be at all sure that the two kings announced by his partner included the heart king.

North's responses to the four and five-notrump bids would have been the same if he had held two small hearts and the king of clubs, and then a grand-slam contract would have been at the mercy of the heart finesse—a very bad gamble

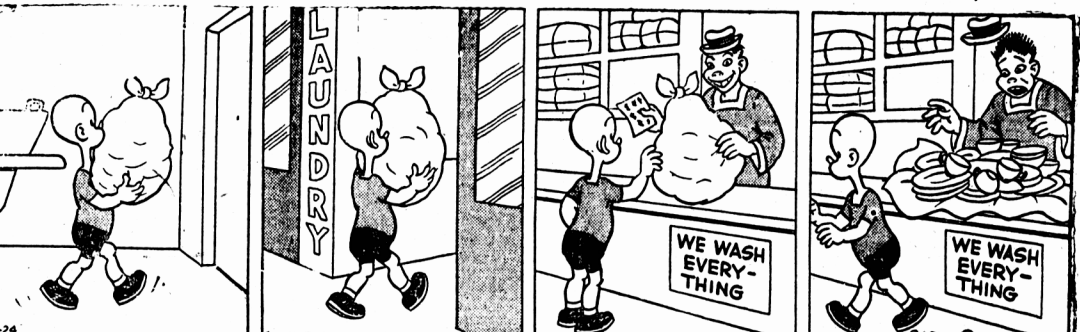

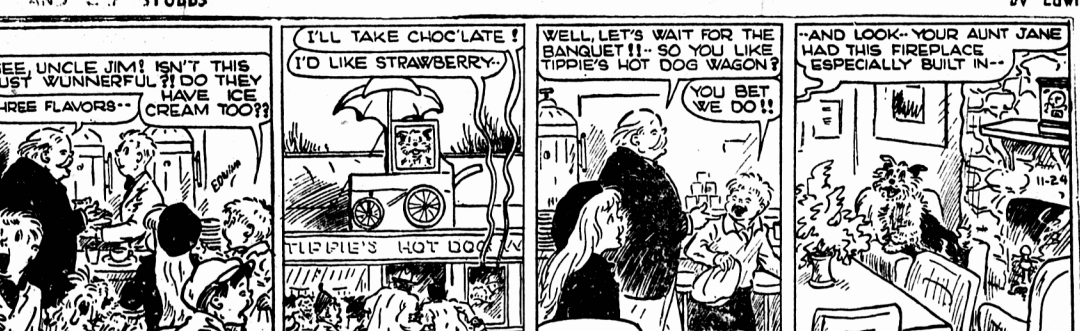
