The Dum-Dum Bullet.

There has been a great deal of misconception about the so-called dum-dum bullets. The English have hitherto got the credit of using this terrible missile, and now it turns out that it is the Boers who are employing it. They have been requested to stop the practice, but are hardly likely to pay much heed. As a matter of fact the British regulation bullet is a modification of the dum-dum, known as Mark IV. The use of the dum-dum became imperative in campaigns against semi-savage troops because of the lack of stopping power of the ordinary Lee-Enfield or Mauser bullet. But it had never been used against civilized troops, and the present missile, though it expands slightly on entering the body, is infinitely more humane than the Springfield bullet, until lately in use by the United States army.—San Francisco News Letter.

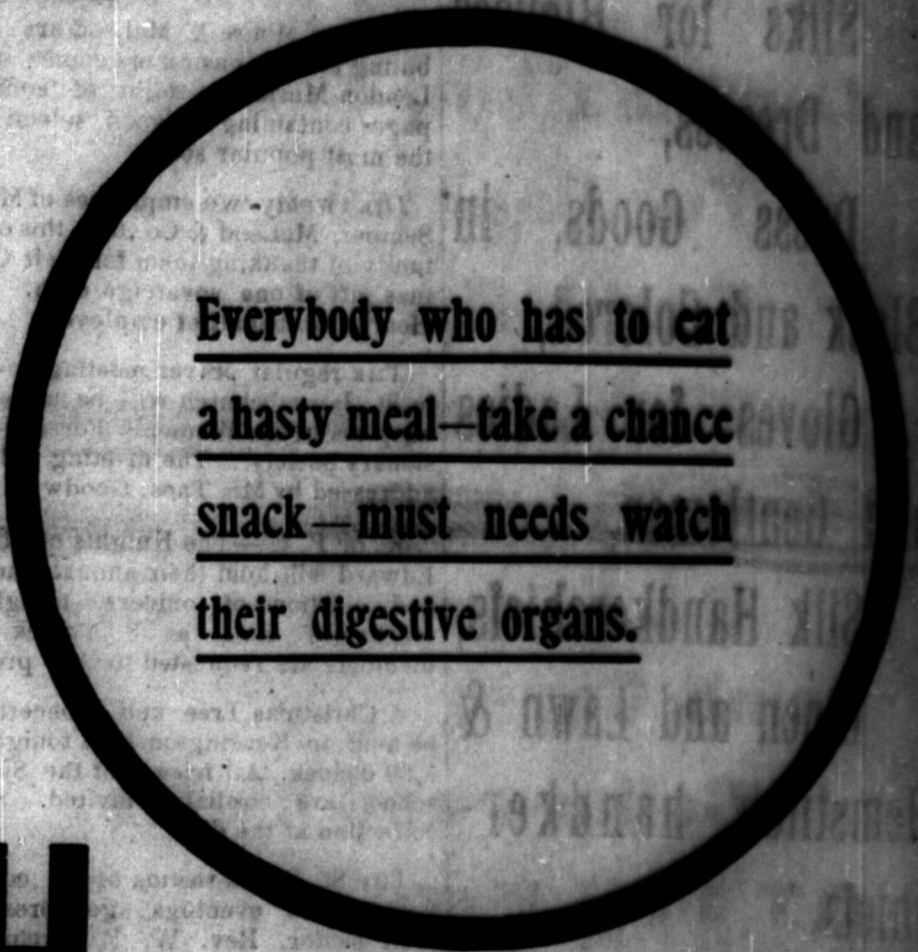
