



THE SENATE

As usual when Parliament begins its session the fact crops up that no one is quite satisfied with the Senate. One remarks that the Revd. Chamber originates nothing; another that it simply marks time and gives perfunctory attention to the measures which pass the Commons; a third observes that it is cumbered with too many old men who have outlived their activity and usefulness; a fourth takes note that the Senate is out of touch with the country, that few or none of the public think it worth while to attend upon its sittings, and few newspapers think it worth while to report its sayings and doings.

There is at least a large measure of truth in these criticisms, but the country is not yet ready to abolish the Upper House and do the public business with one Chamber as many of the Provincial Legislatures do. The supreme Parliaments in almost all countries have two Chambers established. Some would try the elective plan, with large constituencies. That was tried in Old Canada, before the Union and was also tried in Prince Edward Island. But here the elective Upper chamber was abolished and in the west at Confederation, after the best of some experience, the elective plan for the Senate found few advocates. Better appointments made from those not too old, and retirement at the age of say seventy five, with or without a modest pension, special representation for the Universities and the press are among the more practical suggestions for improvement.

For each of those proposed plans something might be said. The age limit for retirement seems necessary, and yet it must be admitted that some Senators are more capable at 80 years than others at 60. This might be met by a requirement that for continuance in the Senate after the age of 75 a two third vote of the Senators under that age should be required. The Senate might be greatly strengthened by the appointment of some of the strong men from the Universities who have given study to economic questions and to history. In like manner it might be profitably reinforced by the accession of a few men from the editorial desk who have spent their years in the discussion of public and political affairs. There is, however, little prospect at present that any of these suggestions will be acted upon. Thick and thin supporters of the party in power have been and always will be the choice of governments so long as the present system of appointment prevails.

As the Canadian Courier puts it: "There are plenty to choose from, and yet men unfit to be Ministers and men whose neighbors judge them unfit to be Commissioners are pitched into the Red Chamber to keep them quiet."


TORONTO "NEWS" AND PARLIAMENT.

Toronto News which is watching Parliament keenly from the independent viewpoint concludes that it has opened in a distinctly ugly tempo; that some of the speeches can only create a bad impression in the country; that the government is depending too much upon its voting strength and debating power and is disposed to browbeat the Opposition; that the Opposition is relying too much on abuse and scandal mongering which will not help it

cause in the country, until the charges are proved; that when Mr. Fielding claims the Liberal platform of 1893 has been carried out, his claim is true in the sense that the famous platform was carried out in the dark night and buried in the back yard.

THE LATE KING OSCAR.

The death of King Oscar of Sweden has removed from the throne one of the better class of continental sovereigns. He was born in 1829 and succeeded to the throne of Sweden and Norway in 1872. He was a great grandson of the great Napoleon's general Bernadotte, and inherited the talents and high character which belonged to his lineage. After reigning thirty-four years over both Sweden and Norway his last years were clouded by the secession of Norway, which was however, peacefully effected. His eldest son, the Crown Prince Gustavus Adolphus, born in 1858, has been proclaimed King under the title of Gustav V. The Crown Prince was married in 1881 and has three sons. It will thus be seen that the succession is well provided for.

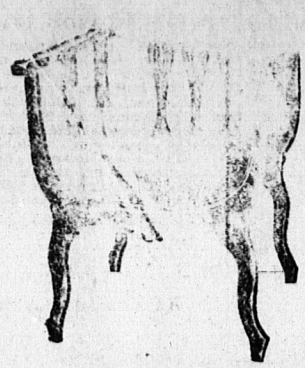
