A gentleman in Halifax writing to a friend in Charlottetown encloses the following extracts in reference to the sports held there on Saturday.

The Wanderers were very wise Wednesday evening when they postponed their annual electric light games to Saturday night as they had a beautiful evening and about 2500 people present—the largest attendance yet, except upon more special occasions. The Wanderers committee deserve every praise for the manner in which the sports were conducted; the events were run off in sharp time, there was always something to interest the spectators, and the big program was run through in 2½ hours. Trainer Mack expressed the opinion that he had never seen a series of games better conducted anywhere. The benefit of the work of Trainer J. J. Mack was thoroughly apparent among the Wanderers; instead of jumping away from the line in the starts of the sprints, held to their marks; there was a display of form and style shown by his men which was different to that in the past, and was particularly noticeable in Murphy's finish in the mile. There was one M. P. record broken during the evening and one equalled; Father Time was ousted in the ¼ mile bicycle race by Harold Anderson of the Wanderers, who won both his trial and final heats of the quarter in 31 1/5. He won quite handily, giving a fine exhibition, and he was presented with a special prize by President Curry for his record-breaking feat. Frank Stephen was the one who equalled the M. P. record, and for the first time in Halifax a record of 10 seconds was made in a 100 yds. sprint. The champion sprinter has made this time in other places, but never in Halifax. He won his trial in 10 1/5, but in his final he had to give Pasesa 5 yards, who with this handicap had won his trial in 10 1/5. Pasesa got away in splendid style in the final, and Stephen was behind him until within five yards of the finish, when he made an extra spurt and won by a yard in 10 seconds. It was the first time he has ever been handicapped here that he has had to win out at the finish, and the result was the spectators saw him show a great burst of speed. Ruggles was not up to his form in the field events, which brought out some new men in the Wetberbe, Dryden and Carney, who all did good work. [It will be remembered that Messrs. Stephens and Ruggles took part in the sports on C. A. A. grounds on Dominion Day.]
