Peter Volo (4) 2.02, now stands credited with a greater number of 2.10 performers than his noted sire, Peter the Great (4) 2.07 1/2. Peter Volo had one week ago 160 trotters and pacers in the 2.10 list. Peter the Great has 159 in the list.

When Peter the Great became a century sire of 210 performers, many thought that he would establish a mark in regard to speed of this kind that could never be surpassed. However, his son Peter Volo has already overtaken his sire and it would not be surprising that within the next few years he will go one hundred over the record made by Peter the Great.

It may be interesting to breeders here to know that when Peter Volo's first crop of foals appeared they were very much faulted by many expert horsemen, the chief reason being that very few displayed the early speed expected and the majority showed extremely stubborn qualities. Harry Burgoyne who was then manager of Walnut Hall Farm, could see further than others and urged his owners to purchase Peter Volo which they did. As soon as he arrived at Walnut Hall Farm good breeders like John L. Dodge, A. B. Cox and others flocked to him with the result that in a few years his colts and fillies became the most sought after in America.

Speaking about the dispersal of the Calumet Farm studs, Peter the Brewer 2.02 1/2, Truax 2.03 1/4, etc., the American Sportsman says—"Horses from Calumet Farms pastures and paddocks won practically every stake on the turf during its existence. The breeding of Mary Reynolds (3) 2.05 3-4, (3) 2.03 3-4, recent winner of the \$40,000 Hambletonian Trotting Stake at Goshen, N. Y., is interesting. She is by Peter the Brewer sired by Peter the Great. Peter the Brewer's dam is Zombrower 2.04 1-4, by Zombro. The dam of Mary Reynolds is Aileen Guy (5) 2.03 1-4 by Guy Axworthy (4) 2.08 3-4, dam Aileen Bacon 2.18 1-4 by Peter the Great.

It will be noted that her sire, Peter the Brewer is by Peter the Great and her granddam Aileen Bacon is by Peter the Great. There is no doubt but that she possesses unusual qualifications as a trotter and it would not be surprising to see her secure a record of two minutes before the season is over.

An interesting thing regarding the breeding of Mary Reynolds is the fact that her sire, Peter the Brewer (4) 2.02 1-2, now one of the greatest sires in the world, is out of Zombrower 2.04 1-4, also the dam of Land League. You will remember we wrote something about Land League in these columns a few weeks ago when we mentioned that he was the sire of Lady Lee 2.20 1-4, record taken at Georgetown, N.S., the property of Mr. W. L. Toombs, Kensington.

In other words, they have a blood-thirsty complex.

What can be done with the right kind of management is illustrated at the Ionia, Mich., Fair, this year, when the largest record for nine years was exceeded by forty per cent. A good show with good advertising produced the results.

Another good winner at Troy, Ohio, the same day, was Single Bob by Single G. This lad making his second start of the season took a record of 2.11 1-2 at Troy, Ohio, last week in a winning race. He is by Truax 2.03 1-4, a son of Guy Axworthy with a Peter the Great dam.

Comte Mangelli of Milan, Italy, has purchased from the Hanover Farms, the three year old trotting filly Topsey Hanover 2.04 for a price of \$6,000.

The track record of 2.03 1-4 at Sadale, Mo., was lowered last week to 2.03 by Peter F. J., when he won the third heat of the 2.10 trot in 2.03 flat. The same afternoon the pacing record for the track was lowered by Dale Direct when he won the second heat of the 2.16 pace in 2.02 1-4. It was again broken the same afternoon in the free for all when the old war horse, Kinney Direct 2.00 1-4, won the second heat of his race in 2.01 1-2. It is a mile track.

The fastest mile trotted by a two year old to date this year is that of Muscletone by Mr. McElwain 1.59 1-4, dam Ruth M. Chenault 2.03 1-4, Muscletone won at Goshen, N. Y., recently in 2.06 3-4. Bertha C. Hanover 2.07 sister to three two minute trotters is the leading money winning two year old so far.

Only one trotter or pacer has beaten two minutes so far this year. We refer to Dick Reynolds 1.59 3-4, winner of the renowned Single G. 1.58 1-2.

Sampson Hal 2.02 3-4 now owned by Mr. G. H. Buntan of this city, was a real bearcat in his third and fourth year old form. Ireland, Scotland, Wales, Denmark, Germany, Australia, South Africa and India will all have teams on the spot.

After the play in Copenhagen is over the Americans will go on tour, meeting the crack players of Germany, Holland, England, Ireland, Scotland and Wales, returning to the United States in November.

The games popularity is such that field hockey is played by women in many countries in addition to those named, notably, Egypt, Japan, China, India, Ceylon, Trinidad, South America and Europe.

Some wonderful records have been recently made in archery. For instance, Homer Prouty of Portland, Oregon, a middle aged man with powerful shoulders, recently shot an arrow 478 yards from the erect or standing position. Curtis Hill of Dayton, Ohio, lay on his back with his bow strapped to his feet, pulled the bow cord back with both hands and let fly. The arrow travelled 518 yards. The performances of these two men constitute world's records, that is so far as we know. It may be that Robin Hood could shoot further in his day, but there is no authentic record.

North American open trap shooting championship was concluded at Vandalia, Ohio, last Monday. E. C. Woodward of Houston, Texas, won first by breaking 199 out of 200 targets. The battle for second place was a ripper. Tommy Lovett won it after shooting off with five others who tied with 198 out of 200.

When James C. Christie of the University of Michigan, won the two mile Canadian Amateur swim championship at Toronto last Saturday night, he lowered the Canadian record from fifty-two minutes to 47 minutes 30 seconds. On the same day Florence McVey of Providence, R. I., won the women's senior in the New England long distance championship by swimming the two and a half mile course in one hour twenty minutes.

Horseshoe pitching has become so popular at San Mateo, California, that it threatens to rival the sports for which that suburban city is chiefly noted, polo and golf. To accommodate the new enthusiasts of this once rural pastime the City authorities have installed floodlights in the city park for night playing.

The touring Japanese track and field team won four out of the five events in which its members competed at Buenos Aires, Argentina, last Monday. The 800 metres was won by them in 1.57 4-5, which is a fifth of a second better than the Japanese record. The Japanese won the pole vault with a leap of 12 ft. 11 1-8 inches, while an Argentine athlete won the hop, step and jump covering 45 ft 9 1-4 inches.
