FRENCH TROUBLES IN MONTREAL.

(Canadian Press.) MONTREAL, Sept. 6—The dispute over the election of a board of directors of the Banque Internationale Du Canada advanced a stage yesterday afternoon when the French interests, constituting 55 per cent of the total slate of shareholders, secured quo warranto against the present officers of the bank on an application for an injunction to restrain the present board of directors from making a call for payments of additional instalments on the stock were dismissed with costs, the court in the main pointing out that the petitioners, as far as a second application was concerned, had failed to show that in the absence of an injunction, stood to suffer irreparable injury.

HENRI BOURASSA CHALLENGED.

(Canadian Press.) MONTREAL, Sept. 6—Joseph Monnet has issued a challenge to Henri Bourassa and to the editors of certain French-speaking newspapers of Montreal to enter into a debate on the subject of Manoir College removal controversy. It is stated that there is considerable feeling in town over the college question and a large meeting is anticipated. As matters stand the Manoir College priests can be relieved of suspension "a divinis" on the sole condition that they leave St. John's. There are still seven of the priests in town, the remainder having to take up work in other localities. Efforts have been made to have Sir Lomer Gouin and Joseph Damers, federal member for the county, interview Bruchesi on the subject.

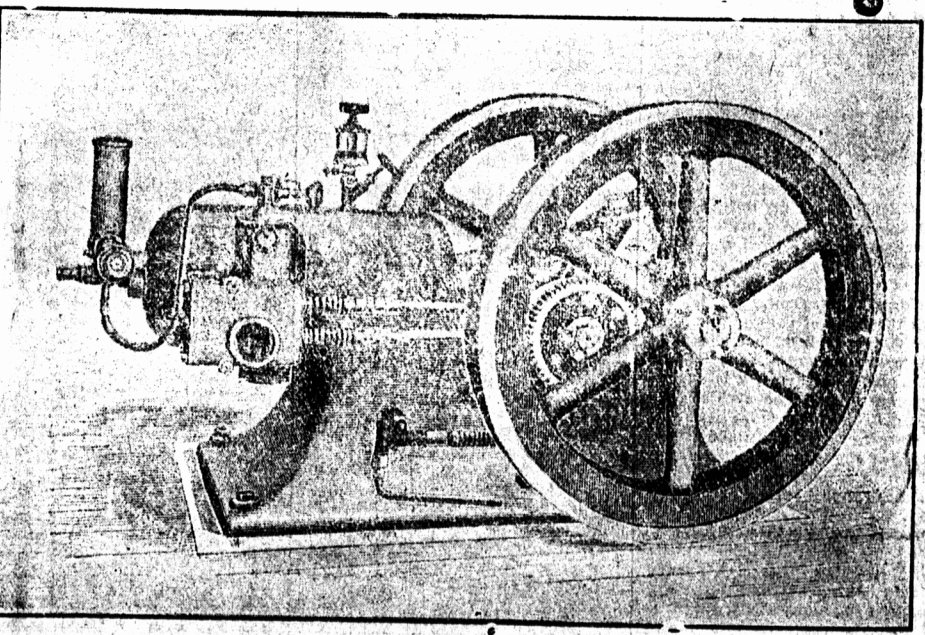
