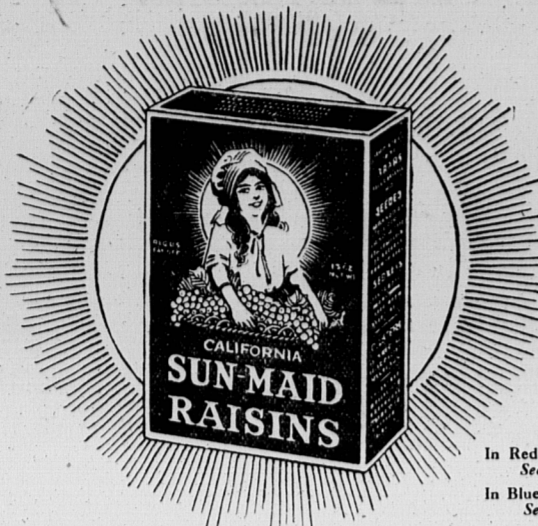

To Add 100 Planes WASHINGTON, March 17.—On the heels of the sharp controversy over the value of airplanes the War Department has ordered a fleet of 100 new observation and pursuit machines, the cost of which will run to nearly \$1,500,000. The War Department also announced awards of \$70,000 to the Curtiss Company and \$60,000 to the Douglas Company for its recent successful demonstration of more maneuverable observation planes.
