THE COOK'S CORNER Living & Leisure - The Woman's Realm

1-2 cup water 1-4 cup butter 1-4 teaspoon salt 1 cup sifted flour 2 eggs, unbeaten Method: Place the water, butter and salt in a saucepan and heat. When boiling briskly, add the sifted flour all at once and stir vigorously until it has been thoroughly blended into the liquid ingredients.

POPOVERS 2 eggs 1 cup flour 1-2 teaspoon salt 1 cup milk 1-2 teaspoon melted butter Method: Beat eggs with a rotary beater until light and lemon-colored. Sift the flour, then measure and sift again with the salt and sugar.

HOUSEHOLD HINTS For a better flavor, add a little lemon juice and grated lemon rind when stewing dried prunes, figs, peaches, pears and even apricots. You can restore a discolored aluminum pot to shiny newness by cooking rhubarb or apples in it.

CORNMEAL TART SHELLS 1 cup flour 1-2 teaspoon salt 1-2 cup cornmeal 1-2 cup butter 4 tablespoons ice water, about Method: Sift the flour and salt together and then mix in the cornmeal thoroughly. Add the butter and cut this in with two knives or a pastry blender until the mixture is in coarse crumbs.

OVERSEAS WHEAT CARGOES

A verification report on the 1939 overseas wheat cargoes has been completed by J. G. C. Fraser, Chief Division, Dominion Department of Agriculture. The report indicates that Thatcher wheat has very largely replaced Marquis as the main constituent in the Atlantic cargoes, although the Pacific cargoes remain practically the same as those of 1938, of which Red Bobs was the principal constituent. The percentage of Garano in the Northern grades remains low.
