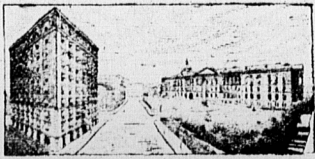

## SUFFRAGISTS IN LIMITED SENSE

ST. JOHN, Jan. 23.—Mrs. H. H. Pickett, Mrs. Fiske, Mrs. Colby Smith appeared before the government Thursday in an effort to secure female suffrage in the province along certain restricted lines. They were told that the matter would receive consideration at the hands of the administration.

The delegation asked that the Provincial Franchise Act be so amended as to allow the women who now vote in municipal elections to also vote in provincial affairs. This, as it was pointed out, would merely mean the extension of the franchise to the widows and spinsters paying property taxes.

A member of the delegation in conversation with The Sun last night, deprecated the idea of female suffrage extended into the federal arena. "We only ask," said she, "that widows and spinsters when taxed for property be allowed to exercise a franchise in provincial elections."

"For some years women have voted in municipal elections," said the lady, "and there seems no valid reason why our request should not be granted. Our first and best reason would undoubtedly be exerted in the event of the claim being sustained. Goodness only knows politics are bad enough and it is indeed time that something were done."

"Do we hope for ultimate success? Of course, but we can never tell, politicians are such courteous, non-committal things."

It is understood that further action in the matter is shortly to be taken.

## BUSINESS OF THE ALBERTA LEGISLATURE

EDMONTON, Alta., Jan. 21.—The address in reply having been moved and seconded by J. T. Moore (Red Deer) and A. S. Ross (Edmonton) respectively, the entire session of the legislature Tuesday was taken up in a discussion of the speech from the throne. The opposition speakers strongly criticized the government on various matters of policy and came out flat-footed to state-owned railways. They thought that because the federal government had taken the provincial lands the should build new roads. Premier Rutherford said the policy regarding extension of railways would be laid before a House within a few days. He argued government ownership of interior telegraph lines was a matter requiring the most careful consideration if not actually modification, of the British North American Act.

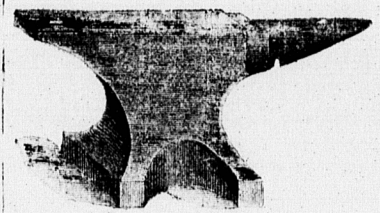
