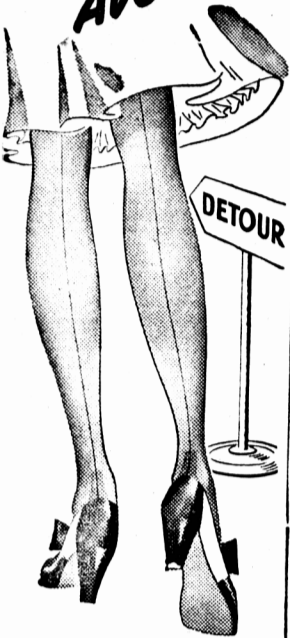

Women To Release Men for Aircrew

R.C.A.F. Headquarters has announced that a third Manning Depot for the training of airwomen has just been opened in Western Canada. Up to the present time, basic training has been given to women at two Manning Depots situated at Toronto and Rockcliffe, Ontario.

The opening of the new Manning Depot means that the R.C.A.F. will now be able to train a thousand more recruits monthly. As a result, larger quotas have been allotted to Recruiting Centres across Canada, and the opportunities open to women are greater than ever before. There will henceforth be no delay between application and enlistment. Qualified women can be enlisted immediately as Cooks, Stenographers, Photographers, Telephone Operators, etc. Women are also wanted for General Duties and many other trades where special experience is not required.

This gives a splendid opportunity to all women to help in the present struggle, and to release still more men to drop bombs on Berlin, and knock Goering's Air Force out of the sky.

An important announcement from Ottawa increases the age limit for Air Gunners to 39 years. This opens the way for many men eager to fly, who could not do so before due to age restrictions. The same requirements are in effect for this branch of service with the exception of age limit. Men must be keen, healthy, and alert.

There are still many openings for men who want to train as aircrew. If applicants haven't the necessary education, but have ability to absorb knowledge quickly, the R.C.A.F. is prepared to give them the required education. This is a chance, not only to be of great service to Canada, but at the same time, to acquire a useful education. At the present time, there are openings in ground trades for experienced Carpenters, Draughtsmen, Stationery Engineers, Firemen, Master Mechanics, Trawler Operators, Motor Boat Crewmen, and Welders, as well as many other trades.

CARAMEL CUSTARD PIE

This pie-filling mixture may be strained into wet custard cups and placed in a pan of hot water, for baking at 325 degrees until set; chill and serve from the custard cup, or unmolded, top with whipped cream and garnish. 2-1/2 cups milk 1-3 teaspoon salt 1-4 cup sugar 4 tablespoons caramel syrup. Few drops pure vanilla. Rich pie-paste. Heat milk (or diluted evaporated milk) to scolding point in upper part of double boiler. Beat eggs slightly and add salt and sugar; stir in the hot milk, then the caramel syrup. Add vanilla and strain into paste-lined pie-pan. Bake in a hot oven, 425 to 450 degrees, for ten minutes; then lower heat sharply to 325 degrees (a rather slow oven) and bake until paste is done and filling set so that a knife inserted in the centre comes out clean. Chill to serve.

CLEAN YOUR OIL PAINTINGS

When it comes to give that oil painting in the parlor the old once-over, most housewives approach the task with timidity seasoned by a dash of awe. Let them relax. Oil paintings can be safely cleaned with lukewarm water and all-pure, sunny-yellow bar soap. Wash only a small section of the canvas at a time, and wipe it dry. When the entire surface is clean, go over it with a cloth dipped in linseed oil to prevent cracking.

DON'T RUSH INTO MARRIAGE TO AVOID BEING AN OLD MAID

Single Blessedness Better Than Marital Unhappiness

One of the principal reasons given by the girls who are rushing into hasty war marriages with the old beaux they have turned down a dozen times before, or with the soldiers and sailors whom they met night before last at a service ball, is that they don't want to be old maids, which seems to them the most terrible fate that can befall a woman. 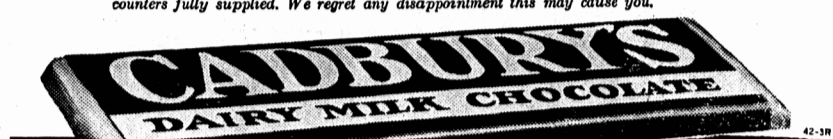
