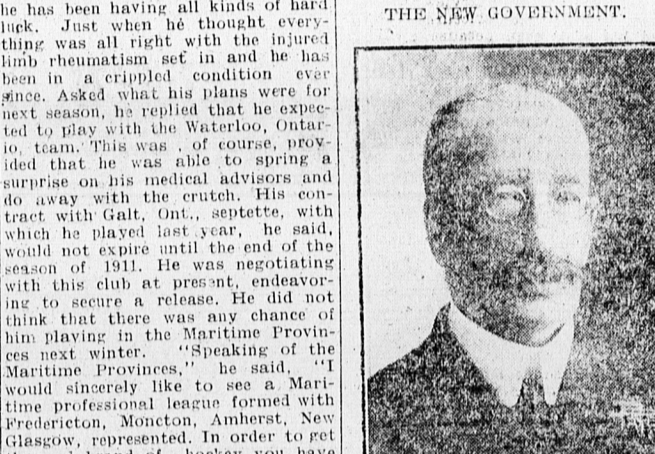

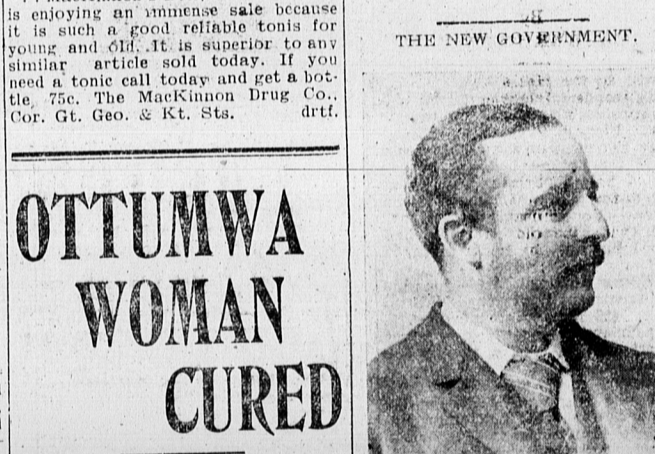

Premier of P. E. Island.

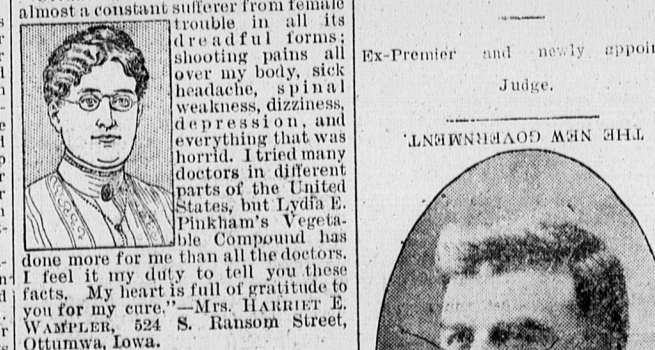

CLOSING STOCK LETTER.

(From F. B. McCurdy & Co's Private Wire.)

New York—The market opened active and strong at about last night's closing level. Profit taking on a large scale failed to produce at any time a reaction which, as new buying was more than sufficient to absorb all of the early offerings. After a brief period of hesitation the market began to advance and during the greater part of the day showed remarkable strength and breadth in all departments. Active issues advanced on an average of about one per cent, over last night's close, and issues like Louisville which had been more or less neglected yesterday, ran up sharply on comparatively small transactions. In the late trading the weight of profit taking finally told on values and prices declined from half to three-quarters of a point from the high level. The decline was caused merely by profit taking sales tempted by the great advance which the market has had in the past two days and at the lower level absorption was extremely good. In the industrial list, Steel Common was easily the most prominent feature, advancing nearly two points over last night's close on enormous transactions and holding the greater part of its gain. Union Pacific again led the railroad list but the strength and activity was so very general that many other of the active issues were but little behind. If pessimism has apparently suddenly disappeared from Wall Street and more bull talk can now be heard than for months past. The market closed active and strong for the most part at only slight fractional recessions from the best prices of the day.
