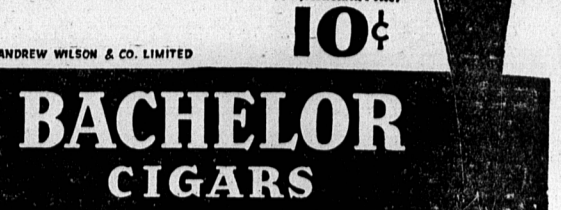

to make the stand so strong that it will be practically indestructible. Each beam or cross-piece where it connects with another or any brace dovetailing into another is cemented with black cement so that water can never permeate into it and rot the wood. The seats and backs are sloped slightly which will add to the comfort of the spectators. The platform along the front is three feet 6 inches wide, leaving ample room to pass along. The entire back is closed, running up several feet above the level of the seats, thus forming a windbreak. Galvanized nails and spikes were used throughout, thus adding strength and life to the whole structure. Cedar posts were used to rest the frame on and these were sunk four feet in the ground after being treated with asphalt to preserve them.

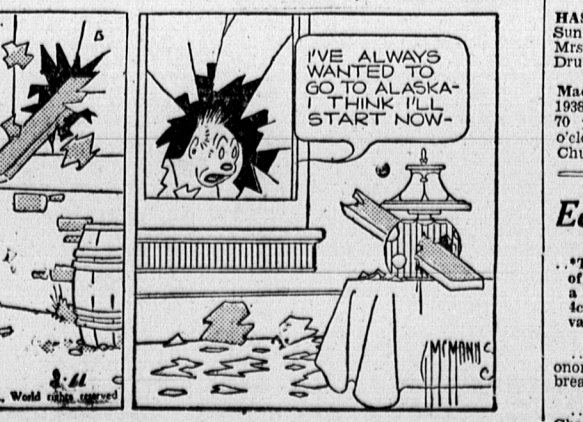
