TRURO, N. S., May 21.—The fearful level crossing almost claimed a victim here this morning after the arrival of No. 18 train. In order to attach extra cars necessary to equip the train for the heavy traffic east of Truro the day coach is shunted West of Young Street Crossing and the addition made. Then the hunch is returned over the crossing and a coupling made.

Everett Bernhill of Old Barns was in company with others driving cattle to the freight shed for shipment to Halifax. Amongst the drove was a bull which he was leading having the rope attached in such a way to one of his hands that he was unable to detach it quickly.
