TO BREAK ICE--The Douglas H. Thomas, a tug well-known at Charlottetown and other Island ports, has been sent to open up the ice in the inner harbor at Sydney, for navigation. Mr. S. P. Challoner, of the traffic department of the Dominion Coal Company made the arrangements.

A SUCCESSFUL COMPANY--One of the most successful 1913 fox trotting has been the Rogers Payton Co. The promoters only secured the six pairs of high class animals now in their ranch on Nov. 1st and since then they have organized their company and disposed of practically all the \$185,000 capital stock. ACCIDENT--Mr. Joseph McDonald (Aeneas) formerly of Mt. Stewart met with a very serious accident in a mill in New Glasgow, N. S., a few days ago. While Mr. McDonald was working, his hand got caught in the machinery and was so badly crushed that amputation was necessary. His many friends tender their sincerest sympathy to Mr. McDonald in this regrettable misfortune. It is also regrettable to learn that Mr. John Peelan, Mt. Stewart, had his thumb and finger badly crushed in the same mill.--L.

SHORT COURSE--To the students of the Short Course on Friday afternoon Professor Ross delivered a short lecture on the value of good seeds in the improvement of farm crops. He pointed out that the seed was a small plant with nourishment stored up to give it a start in life. This was the reason for their looking for the largest and plumpest seed of grain or of clover or timothy. He next referred to freedom from weed seeds as being another quality of good seed and spoke of the great loss that resulted from increase of weeds. Professor Davidson, he said, had been giving classes in the identification of weed seeds, and he supposed that most of the students present could identify those seeds and could select their own clover and timothy seeds with good judgment. The Government, however, never compelled the seed merchants to grade all clover and timothy seeds that were being offered on the market and now every farmer has an opportunity of buying Extra No. 1, No. 2 or No. 3. He strongly advised them to purchase the very best quality they could, and told them that if they purchased together they could send a sample to the seed analyst at Ottawa and find out exactly the quality they were buying. Several questions were asked regarding the amount of seed to be sown to the acre, etc. Professor Davidson also addressed the class. He spoke of Artificial Fertilizers. There was no hard and fast rule, he said, governing the application of mineral fertilizers, in regard to either the amounts or the proportion of the different constituents. The farmer could only ascertain that by personal experiment. The outline of simple experiments was given by means of which the ordinary farmer, taking a little care, could find out of what elements the soil was chiefly in need. The buying of fertilizers under the brand name was deprecated; in fact, no fertilizer gave as good results as home-mixed, which could be easily made and which effected a saving of as much as \$10 on the ton.

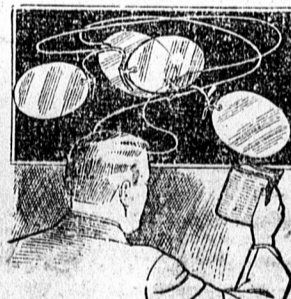
