Early Railway History In Maritimes Recalled

The month of September contains an important anniversary date in the transportation history of the Maritime Provinces, and it is an anniversary of an event that brought in its wake great changes in the political life of the Maritime Provinces as well as their trade.

On September 14, 1853, the first part of the first railway system to be operated as a common carrier in Canada's Atlantic Provinces was turned in the city of Saint John in New Brunswick, the railroad, which was known as the European and North American, was built primarily as a connection between the ports of New York and Boston with that of Halifax to take off mails and passengers, but while this was the first intention the railway actually became part of confederation.

One of the cardinal principles of the Confederation pact was the undertaking by the Dominion Government to construct a railway connecting the Atlantic at Halifax and Saint John with the St. Lawrence at Quebec, the railway to be known as the Intercolonial, which now forms part of the Atlantic Region of the Canadian National Railway system and takes in the former European and North American and Nova Scotia Railways. It was formally opened for traffic from Halifax and Saint John through to Quebec on July 1, 1876, connecting the former railway system with the former St. Lawrence Railway which extended easterly to Quebec and Riviere du Loup and also now forms a part of the National System.

From 1827 on the people of New Brunswick were agitated concerning the construction of a railway to connect the port of St. Andrews with Quebec, and following a series of meetings a company was formed in October 1833 under the name of St. Andrews and Quebec Railway Company. Although lawyers at Quebec, the railroad it was never constructed according to the original intentions, for the Ashburton Treaty of 1842 ceded to the United States a portion of land which was then considered to be comprised within the boundaries of the province of New Brunswick and through which the line was to run, and for this reason the project was dropped.
