Lifelong Democrat, Formerly Congressman and State Senator, Urges Necessity of McKinley's Re-election.  
MCLEANSBORO, Ill., Oct. 3.—1 lieutenant Colonel James R. Campbell, of the Thirtieth United States Volunteers arrived here on Saturday, from the Philippines on a thirty day's leave of absence. The Colonel is of the opinion that the Islands are a great acquisition to the United States in a commercial way, and says that the re-election of McKinley would soon restore peace and prosperity. The Colonel has been a life long Democrat and one of the most prominent in southern Illinois, having served one term in Congress and for a number of years represented the Forty-sixth Senatorial District as State Senator. He is now an expansionist of the Republican type, and believing that the election of McKinley in November is the quickest way to settle the Philippine question, is every true and loyal American to vote for him.
