SPRAYING.-The second spraying of fruit trees is now about over for this season. Mr. Leslie Tennant was yesterday working at the orchard at St. Vincent's Orphanage, but he could do some of the trees far out to spray. Mr. Leo McDonald spent the day at Falconwood orchard and he experienced the same difficulty as did Mr. Tennant. Mr. Couglin has for the past two weeks been pruning and fitting up old orchards in Prince County. He returned last night to Charlottetown and goes to-day to Hillsborough.

ATHLETIC GATHERING.-The Abegweit A.A.A. will hold a Dominion Day Athletic gathering on their grounds, for which a splendid program of bicycle and running events has been arranged. It is expected that some novel and entertaining events will comprise part of the program. Athletic gatherings held on July in the past have proved highly successful and have been largely patronized. No doubt the event this year will be as eagerly looked forward to. The track will immediately be got ready, and a contract has been made for the erection of a new fence at the eastern end of the Abegweit grounds. Suitable prizes will be offered in all the events.

A FISH STORY.-Messrs James McPhee and Fred Ward of this city went fishing on Thursday the 11th, inst. They spent a well-earned holiday in this way at Senzier's Mills near Milton and returned late in the evening with two large strings of speckled beauties. As anglers of considerable experience they freely expressed the opinion that the best time to catch trout is in the evening twilight. It will be remembered that it was near Milton that an enormous trout was nearly captured by two gentlemen from this city only a few weeks ago.
