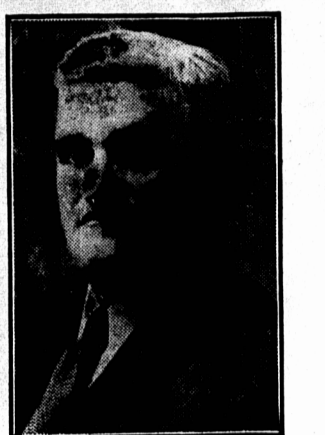

Already the stage is set and organization is in full swing for the Canadian Red Cross Campaign to raise Ten Million Dollars to carry on the work of that noble organization for another year - 'Invitation Year'.

It is most pleasing to announce today that practically the whole organization which so very successfully conducted last year's Red Cross campaign have been prevailed upon to take on the big job again and it is felt that once again this organization will lead Prince Edward Island to the earliest attainment of its objective and also again to the greatest per centage in ex-

cess of its objective. Mr. D. J. Bonnelli will again head the organization as Provincial Chairman. With him again will be the same four vice-chairmen, each taking charge of one of the four areas into which the Province has been divided - Captain Norcross, W. Lowther for Charlottetown, Mr. Peter G. Clark for Summerside and Prince County, Mr. A. F. McQuaid, K. C. for Kings County and Mr. H. F. MacPhee, K. C. for Queens County apart from Charlottetown.

His Honour the Lieutenant Governor, Honourable Premier Campbell and Honourable George D. De-

Blais have consented to act as Patrons and Hon. Dr. W. J. McMillan, provincial president and Mr. George J. Tweedy, K. C. representative of the national council are Honorary Chairman. Mr. George M. Moore, president of Moore & McLeod Ltd., is Honorary Charlottetown Chairman. Major T. Edgar MacNutt is honorary secretary with Miss Iphigene Arsenault, secretary. Mr. Arthur Belcher is honorary treasurer and Mr. Alban Farmer is treasurer. Members of the Provincial Executive are: Dr. J. A. Clark, Dr. H. D. Johnson, Hon. H. H. Cox, Messrs. N. H. DeBlais, J. F. Lightizer, J. E. Campbell, J. J. Dickey, T. Roy Cadmore, E. F. Foley, R. D. Quigley and N. D. McLean. The Publicity Committee consists of Messrs R. L. Cotton, N. D. McLean, W. A. Gaudet, J. R. Burnett, F. J. I. W. C. McLeod and Colonel K. S. Rogers.

The Non-Residents committee is again headed by Mr. Ernest Champlin and the Women's Committee by Mrs. J. A. MacMillan. The collection is scheduled to begin at the first of March and it is hoped that the campaign in Charlottetown will be completely wound up during the first three or four days of the month and that every patriotic friend of the Red Cross throughout the Province, even those in the most out of the way areas will see that his or her contribution reaches some member of the organization just as early in the month as possible.
