TO WHIP THE KAISER—Another Island boy has joined the colors in the person of No. 290791 John A. McPherson, St. John's, Que., who is now at the Engineers Training Station, attached to the Royal Canadian Engineers for overseas service. Pte. McPherson was born in Lyndale and has been in the States for sometime.

FINE FAT CATTLE—Mr. Harry Tweedy, Earncliffe, was in the City Tuesday delivering to Mr. M. W. Wood, Southport, four fat steers, which weighed on the city scales over six hundred pounds. One pair weighed over eighteen hundred pounds. The four cattle are averaging over fifteen hundred pounds each. As successful stock raisers the Tweedy Brothers have few equals in the province.—Q.

EARNCLIFFE—An Earncliffe youth who is doing well in the West is Neil P. Doyle, son of that esteemed fellow citizen Mr. John Doyle. Neil went West about two years ago, and after working a few months with a farmer there took up a half section of land. This spring he has 250 acres ploughed for crop. He is one of the finest young men that ever left this province, always jolly and good natured. Neil was greatly missed when he went away by a large circle of friends all of whom are naturally pleased to learn that he is making such good progress in his new West-ern home.—Q.

NEW BREED OF SHEEP—Last winter Mr. Harry Tweedy, Earncliffe sent an order to A. J. Hickman & Co., Court Lodge, Egerton, Kent, England, for four sheep, one Cotswold ram and three Romney ewes, the latter being the first of the kind to come to this province. Mr. Tweedy received a letter recently from Mr. Hickman saying that the steamer on which he had sent the sheep had been damaged by a submarine, and had to put back to Liverpool for repairs. She would be due to leave again on March 15th for St. John, the nearest quarantine station for P. E. I. The Government regulations for sheep imported from England into Canada provides that the animals must remain in quarantine to thirty days. But as the beginning of the quarantine dates from the day the sheep are shipped Mr. Tweedy's valuable stock with luck should soon be here.—Q.

His departure will take place within the next few weeks.

Mr. McInnis is also a first class stone mason and the foundations of some of the best farm houses in Lot 50 are the work of his skillful hands.—Q.

IN MEMORIAM

MISS EVELYN ARSENAULT.

The death took place at St. Nicholas on March 29th of Miss Evelyn Arsenault, daughter of Moise Arsenault now of Chelsea, Mass. Deceased, who was 38 years of age, had been an invalid for upward of 13 years.
