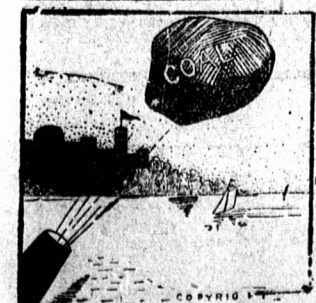


Manchester Liners
