#### ST. JOHN TO TAKE A FLYING SCHOOL.

ST. JOHN, N. B., Dec. 7.—Royden Foley, who has been in the employ of the United States Government for several months in the capacity of aerial expert, has returned to St. John to arrange for opening a flying school here. His study of conditions in the United States has convinced him that Saint John offers every facility for training aviators in both land and sea flying. He intends to start the school about April 1, and will make a beginning with two machines. Mr. Foley has offered his services to the Canadian Government, but has not received a reply. He is a graduate of the Pratt Institute of Brooklyn, a member of the Aerial Club of America and has had six years experience in flying.
