MAIL CONTRACT WITHOUT TENDER

Could you tell me if such practice is customary in the P. O. Department and if customary is it in the public interests that it be continued?

I believe this form of extending minor contracts for the mails has been in practice to some extent under both the present and preceding Governments, where the service has been found satisfactory, and the price reasonable. While not a commendable practice in general, it saves the cost of advertising and in some rare cases may prevent the necessity of paying a higher rate for the service.—Guardian.]
