Air Cadet Camp To Conclude Today

The last Air Cadet summer camp of the 1947 season at the R.C.A.F. Station, Summerside, will conclude today, following inspection and ceremonial review on the parade square this afternoon. The reviewing officer will be Group Captain Lewis, A.F.C., commanding officer at Dartmouth and formerly commanding officer at Summerside.

The five squadrons now in camp are as follows: No. 29, Sydney; No. 106, Windsor; No. 154, Amherst; No. 299, Yarmouth; No. 315, Newcastle.

After the inspection there will be a field day. Present for the occasion will be some of the members of the New Brunswick Civilian Committee who will come over by plane in the morning and return this evening. Some of the Prince Edward Island members will also attend.

The boys will all leave for home tomorrow morning and the Station will revert to its normal condition. All summer there have been approximately 200 boys in camp here. After their departure there will be little activity on the Station until such time as the aircraft and the courses arrive to commence the training that has been planned for this Station. No date has been set for this but it is reported that it will be his fall.—S.

Acadian Teachers Hold Convention

The 55th annual convention of the Acadian Teachers Association opened yesterday morning at Miscouche with High Mass celebrated by Rev. Martin Monaghan. The sermon was preached by Rev. N. Pelrier of Egmont Bay.

The business session opened in the hall with the president, Mr. Ben DesRoches of Miscouche presiding. The delegates were welcomed by Rev. J.D. Kelly, pastor at Miscouche.

The minutes of the last convention, held in Bloomfield, were read by the secretary, Mrs. Ben DesRoches.

Members of the clergy who spoke briefly were: Rev. J.C. Pire, South Rustico; Rev. Wilfred Pineau, Mount Carmel; Rev. Charles Gallant, St. Dunstan's University.

At the afternoon session a paper on good reading was given by Mr. P.A. Arsenault of Tignish School and was discussed principally by Mr. John F. Arsenault, Mont Carmel.

Mr. L.W. Shaw, Deputy Minister of Education, gave a splendid address in which he stressed the need and the school and the necessity of cooperation between the home and the school providing good training in the fundamentals.

Mr. Justice A.E. Arsenault of Charlottetown addressed the meeting on a number of important subjects on education. Mr. Edgar Gallant, B.A., gave a talk on French culture.
