General Kuropatkin is credited with having formulated and signed a complete plan for the invasion and conquest of India by Russia. It is not to take place immediately for obvious reasons. The great Russian commander is for the present very busy where he is. He is likely to be pretty fully occupied during the entire summer. But after the reinforcements for the army have arrived in sufficient force; after the Baltic fleet has reached eastern waters; after Japan's fleet has been annihilated, as the Turkish fleet was at Sinope; after the Japanese armies have been driven into the sea and victorious Russia has dictated the terms of peace at Tokio, then the reckoning with Britain is to be made and India will become the noble trophy of victorious war. It is an ambitious program. There is some natural antipathy between Russia and Britain. The people are of different races and almost wholly of different religious faiths. Britain is a free country, with representative institutions. Her laws are made by a Parliament, the dominant part of which is elected by the people. To this Parliament the Government must account for every dollar of public moneys that is spent, and cannot expend moneys, or lay on new taxes unless the people's representatives first decide to have it done. Men enter her army or her naval service of their own free choice. Russia is a land of autocracy; the will of the Czar is law. The people have no voice in the making of laws, the laying of taxes or the expenditure of public moneys. Military service is obligatory. Freedom does not exist. The British and Russian systems of government are thus as opposite as day and night. Moreover Britain is the ally of Japan. Without that alliance Japan might not have ventured to go to war and Russia would have had a free hand in Manchuria and Korea. She would have gained open winter ports at Chemulpo, Masampo and Fusan. Russia would then have exploited northern China at her will. The "open door" for which Britain, the United States and Japan have contended in diplomacy, would have become a closed door, and all within would be a Russian preserve. Furthermore Russia has been thwarted by Great

Britain at Constantinople and in the Persian Gulf. And Britain is now sending a force into Tibet while Russia's hands are tied. From the Russian standpoint the two nations are enemies by nature, by tradition and by interests. Hence the inevitable war of the future, when Russia has first settled with Japan. Kuropatkin foresees that it will take two campaigns to complete the conquest of India. The first campaign will effect the capture of Afghanistan. Then a pause of two or three years, and then— He tells that he would prefer to begin in November. The climate of India is healthier and the Russian ports are closed by ice.—When we come to think of it, Port Arthur is closed just now, and not by ice. The Montreal Star reproduces half a dozen of Mr. Louison's superb views, with good words for the Island as a summer resort and for Old Home Week.

The Toronto Globe, in some respects the foremost of Canadian journals, has a singularly illogical article on War Talk in Canada. It sets out that to talk of the possibility of war between Canada and the United States "is fraught with the utmost danger." It is "playing the fool with the most dangerous explosives." Why? Because the American people are excitable, have a jingo spirit, a lust for territory and respond all too readily to the slightest provocation or to any incitement like that of Cleveland's Venezuela message. Shall we then prepare for defence, build forts and mount guns? No. The Globe proceeds: "Along our thousand miles of international boundary there is neither a fort nor a gun, except the relics of a bygone age. We proclaim that defenceless state to all the world. We glory in it." But we must not breathe the word war. To discuss such an issue, to clamor for defences is "to fire the very passions that make war possible." "The smell of blood may arouse the tiger." And so on. Surely there is a limp in this sort of logic.

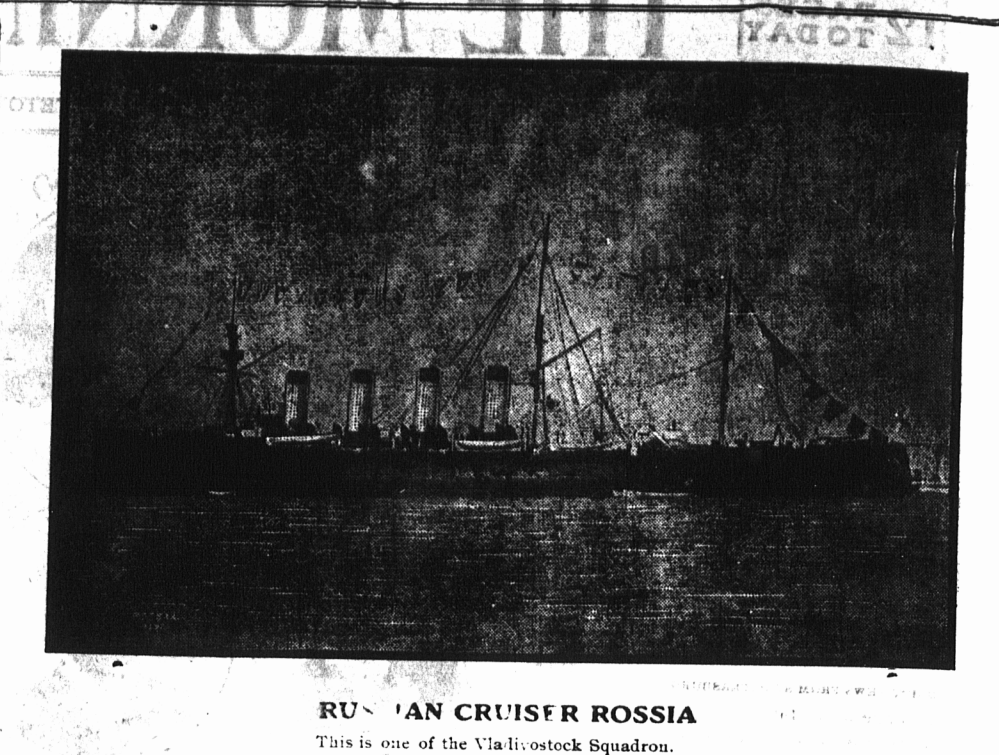

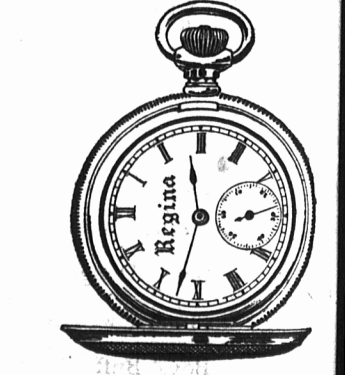
