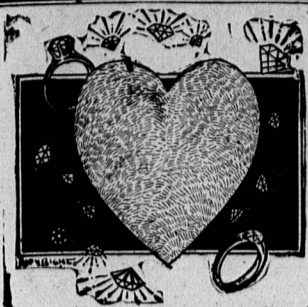

GOLD SEEKERS DESERTING NOME.

SEATTLE, Wash., Oct. 26.—The steamer Umitella arrived from Nome today with 511 passengers and \$250,000 in bullion was followed closely by the steamships Victoria and North-western, each carrying gold and heavy passenger list.

The exodus from Nome marks the end of the romantic period of the famous gold camps history. In the summer of 1900, 70,000 persons were assembled upon the beach at Nome, and were rich in gold dust. The camp has yielded \$10,000,000 in gold and is still producing, but the rich dirt, that could be worked by hand, has been washed and the mining henceforth will be done by dredges on a large scale.

There are nearly 2,500 men in the Inoko and Iditarroo districts and several hundred in the diggings north of Nome. They still are "poor men's camps," but Nome has gone the way of the Klondyke and will transform no more laborers into millionaires.

STORING APPLES.

Last winter the Co-operative Fruit Co., packed apples for the British Market in March. It is not a convenient time to pack apples and this year it is planned to pack them at once and ship them to St. John and keep in cold storage there till such time as is thought best to ship them to the Old Country. For this purpose barrels are being made up as rapidly as possible and it is expected that apples will be received in Charlottetown by the Co-operative Fruit Co., on Tuesday Nov 1st and on the forenoon of Friday Nov. 4th. If enough apples offer in the vicinity of Summerside. Packing will be done then as soon as possible and while packing is going on there will be opportunity for people to bring in more apples. It is useless to attempt to ship to the British Market any apples that are spotted, wormy, bruised, green or injured in any way so as to cause material defect. When these are brought to the ware house they are not packed and are a total loss. Information on this subject can be had at the Dept. of Agriculture.

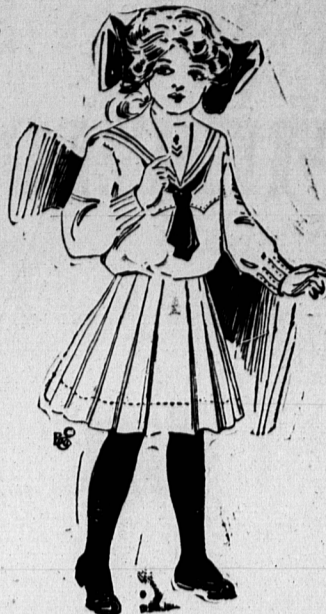
