THE OBJECTIONS MADE TO PRAYER

III Another objection comes in the form of the Sovereignty of Law ours is a day when law has become all in all and Sovereignty. The boys and girls in our schools are being taught the lame doctrine of God not so zealously as they are taught the Immanence and Reign of law. There is such a unity in creative law that the leg of a horse, the hand of man, the paw of a lion and the flapper of a whale are all alike and the likeness here is found in Heaven alone in each beneath and in a world of law how can there be room to answer prayer. Stand in front of a locomotive and prayers will not save you. Break the laws of health and prayers will not restore you, violate the laws of your mind and praying will not bring you peace. So also in the realm of the spirit if a man becomes indifferent and reckless if he turns from God and rights, what is the use to pray? What is the Almighty that we should pray unto him. The answer that we make to this objection is, show that law is the method by which certain things are done—and what is prayer but as a method by which certain things are done. If in the beginning the Great Creator placed physical law in his universe and side by side with these he placed laws of prayer who dares to say that one shall interfere with the other. If God has willed that when we pray certain results shall follow, then meeting these conditions results will follow, and the reign of law need bring no terror to our hearts. Law reigns, but God reigns and prayer reigns. The Law of gravitation reigns over this Bible and keeps it upon the earth. I lift this book and my prayer goes: Forgive his greater force and in answer to prayer God lifts the book half way to the sky, there is no great violation of law. Again force yields to greater force, and if surrounded by his foes, if face to face with danger, if with death imminent the Christ's law prevails God has probably unlimited ways by which He can bring help to his suffering child.

SUNDAY SCHOOL LESSON

FEBRUARY 9.
 John 4: 1-12. Memorize vs. 23, 24.
JESUS AND THE WOMAN OF SAMARIA.
 GOLDEN TEXT.
 "If a man thirst, let him come unto and drink."—John 7: 37.

EXPLANATIONS.

1. Jesus reveals Himself as the Messiah to the woman of Samaria, 19 26. The woman of Samaria had said to Jesus, "Give me this water," i. e., the living water (v. 15; cf. vs. 10, 13 and 14.) Jesus will answer this prayer, but first the woman must be brought to realize that she is a sinner. Conviction of sin usually precedes the reception of the Holy Spirit. So Jesus aimed a sharp thrust at her conscience. "Go call thy husband" (v. 10). It was effective. Heart and life were laid bare. She briefly asserted "I have no husband." But little did she know how Jesus would drive the answer home to her own conscience (vs. 16, 18). The woman tried to parry the thrust by engaging Jesus in a logical discussion. This is a common method used by men when we try to drive home to them a conviction of their own sin. They seek to ease their conscience by drawing us into a discussion on some side theological issue. The woman failed in her attempt. Jesus' answer to her question went even more deeply to the need of her soul. It was beginning to dawn upon the woman that Jesus was a prophet indeed. He had read her heart. Jesus showed her the utter futility and worthlessness of all her worship of which she had made her boast. The standing controversy between the Jews and the Samaritans was whether they should worship at Mt. Zion or Mt. Gerizim (v. 20). Jesus shows to the woman that this is not the real question at issue. The question is not where we shall worship, but how we shall worship. The Jews are strong worshippers which Jesus exposed the hollowness of the worship of the woman and the fellow Samaritans. "Ye worship ye know not what," but the words are equally true of much modern so-called Christian worship. "Salvation is from the Jews." To them were committed the oracles of God (Rom. 9: 4). Of them the Christ the Saviour of the world, is born according to the flesh (Rom. 1: 3). The Jews were the first heralds of a crucified and risen Saviour, in whom salvation is offered to all men. The world owes to the Jews a debt that it can never pay. But while salvation is from the Jews, the Jews as a people have rejected it. The heavenly Father seeking worshippers (v. 23, R. V.). God is seeking not only those who will serve Him and obey Him, but those who will worship Him. He does not find many worshippers, though He is seeking them. Prayer is not worship. Thanksgiving is not worship. Worship is bowing before God in adoring contemplation of His self. "In our prayers we are taken up with our needs; in our thanksgiving we are taken up with our little sins; in our worship we are taken up with Himself, and He is seeking worshippers. Does He find one in you? And God is seeking only one kind of worshippers, those who worship in spirit, that is, in reality, not in mere pretence (cf. Phil. 3: 3, R. V.). The flesh seeks to intrude into every sphere and even into the sphere of worship. But the worship which the flesh promotes is not acceptable to God. We are absolutely dependent upon the Holy Spirit to teach us how to worship and to lead us into acceptable worship. God is a spirit, not a mere outward form. Though God is spirit in His essential essence He demonstrates Himself in visible form (Ex. 24: 9, 10; 33: 18, 23), and the glad day is coming when the pure heart shall see Him (Mt. 5: 8; 1 John 3: 2). LADIES AND GENTLEMEN:—
 Having been nominated at a meeting of Electors of Ward 5 and also requested by a number of voters at that meeting to nominate for the Mayoralty I have decided to do so and will be a candidate for that office at the Civic election in February.

I had the honor of a seat at the Council Board for several years as the representative of Wards 3 and 4 and later on the Board of Sewer and Water Commissioners as Chairman. I feel that my record in these two bodies justifies me in soliciting your support for the Mayor's chair. I am in favor of a certain amount of civic improvements being made each year commensurate with our revenue, but I opposed to any large increase in the bonded debt of the City, more particularly in the money market, it being almost impossible to sell Debentures except at loss—City 3 per cent. Debentures being now offered at a fraction over eighty-three dollars per hundred.
 I would recommend a change in our financial year. The year now closes Dec. 31. Under those conditions it is impossible to get the City accounts before the taxpayers in time to give them an intelligent idea of the City finances before nomination day.
 Should you do me the honor of electing me to the important office of Mayor I will to the best of my ability endeavour to discharge the duties belonging to that office in the best interests of the City, as I have always heretofore done.

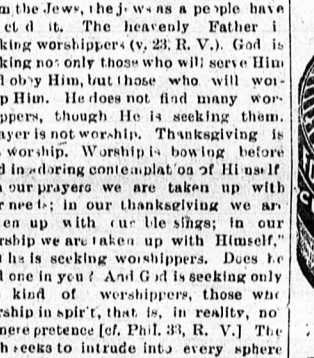
