THE PROHIBITION ACT.

In view of the great interest through-
out the Province in the Prohibitory Law
we subjoin a synopsis of its principal
features. The Prohibitory Act 1900, as it
is called, was passed in the year named,
assented to June 9, and came into force
on June 5, 1901.

The prohibitory provision is in Section
Four, in which there are five sub-sections,
the first of which reads as follows:
"From and after the coming into force
of this Act no person shall by himself,
his clerk, servant or agent, directly or
indirectly on any pretence or upon any
device, keep for sale, sell, or barter, or
in consideration of the purchase of any
other property give to any other person
any intoxicating liquor."

This is the main prohibitory clause. The
penalties are for a first offence \$100 or
three months imprisonment; for a second
offence \$200 or four months and for a
third and every subsequent offence six
months imprisonment without the option
of a fine.

Intoxicating liquor is defined by the
Act "to include all spirituous and malt
liquors and all combinations of liquors
and drinks and drinkable liquors which
are intoxicating." By an amendment to
the Act all liquors or liquids or malt beer
containing over 3 per cent of alcohol is
declared to be intoxicating.

Provision is made for the appointment
of vendors, who may sell to legally qual-
ified physicians, chemists or druggists for
medicinal purposes only, or may sell for
exclusively sacramental purposes on the
certificate of a clergyman affirming that
the wine is required for sacramental pur-
poses.

Druggists are not prohibited from
selling "drugs or medicines mixed with
alcohol or spirituous liquors for purely
medicinal purposes." But the sale of
liquor by druggists or vendors for

medicinal purposes shall be made only on
a prescription or certificate of a duly
qualified resident physician affirming
that such liquor has been prescribed for
the person named therein for use as a
medicine and not as a beverage, and the
quantity shall not exceed 12 ounces, and
no more than one sale or delivery shall
be made on such certificate or prescription.

Provision is made for the sale of liquors
"for bona fide use in some art, trade or
manufacture," but the same can only be
made on the certificate of an Inspector
appointed under the Act, setting forth
that the application is made in good faith
and that the liquor is to be used only for
the particular purpose set forth in the
affirmation of the applicant.

Physicians are permitted to supply
spirituous liquors to their patients in
the regular line of their practice in
quantities not exceeding at any one
time twelve ounces, but must keep a
register of all such sales open to the in-
spection of the Government Inspector.

All vendors, druggists and physicians
are required to keep a register of all
and any sales made by them under
the Act and to produce when required
to the Inspector any prescription, certi-
ficate or register, under penalty for
neglect or refusal, of twenty dollars for
a first offence and forty dollars for a
second or any subsequent offence.

But no Inspector is permitted to
divulge any information obtained by his
inspection of such certificate, prescrip-
tion or register, except on any prosecu-
tion under the Act, and if he does so he
is liable to a penalty of fifty dollars.
And all Inspectors are sworn to secrecy,
unless in case of prosecution.

Provision is made for search warrants
to search for liquors when information is
laid on oath sufficient to satisfy the
Magistrate that there is reasonable
ground for belief that liquor is being sold
or kept for sale contrary to law, and for
the seizure and confiscation of such
liquors and the prosecution of the
offender.

The giving away of liquors, or any
devices to evade the provisions of the
Prohibitory Act is declared an unlawful
selling.

A penalty of \$100 or three months im-
prisonment is provided against any
person who interferes with an officer in
discharge of his duties under the Act.
All fines and penalties recovered under
the Act are paid into the provincial
treasury, but for offences committed in
Charlottetown one third of the fines is
paid to the City Treasurer.

Dr. Percy McLeod of notoriety in
connection with the suit case abortion
and who was acquitted by the court has
been found guilty of unprofessional con-
duct by the Massachusetts Medical
Society. The decision is subject to
appeal. The penalty is expulsion.

The Toronto Globe gives faithful warn-
ing to Mr. Scott, the new Liberal Premier
of Saskatchewan that he must clear his
