YORK MINISTER OBSERVES 13TH CENTURY SINCE ITS FOUNDING BY SAXONS.

LONDON, Jan. 6.—The New Year was ushered in at York by a celebration unique and memorable in the annals of the English Church. Thirteen hundred years ago the Saxon King, Edwin, built a wooden church upon the site where now stands York Minster. The opening celebrations of the founding of the great Cathedral took place on New Year's eve. The dean, canons, choir, and all the officials of the Minster, assembled in the nave, where a temporary altar was erected. The procession went in silence to the great west door, and awaited the ushering in of the New Year by the pealing of the Minster Bells.

Just before midnight the Archbishop of York, Most Rev. C. G. Laug, escorted by torchbearers and chairmen, arrived at the west door. Here he knelt 13 times (betokening the number of centuries since the Cathedral received its inception). The dean thereupon opened the door. A fanfare of trumpets and drums, with the organ assisting, preceded the staging of "All People That on Earth do Dwell." His Grace delivered a characteristically appropriate address, and then led the procession past the holy well—the font of King Edwin's baptism—and so out of the grand old Minster into the first night of the new year.
