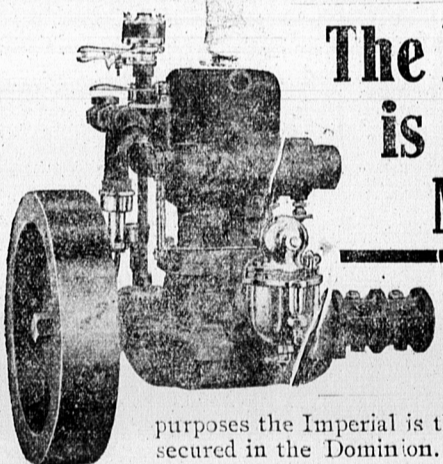

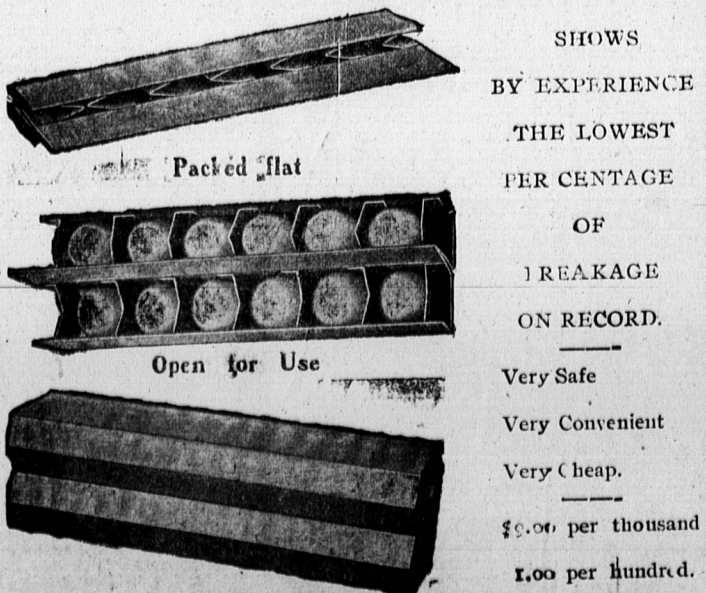

LESSON XI. JUNE 11.
HEZEKIAH'S GREAT PASSOVER.
2 Chron. 30: 13-27.
GOLDEN TEXT.

"Man looketh on the outward appearance, but the Lord looketh on the heart."—1 Sam. 16: 7.

POINTED SUGGESTIONS.

By Rev. D. W. Snider.

The Passover, when observed by a devout people in a devout way, represented the highest expression of worship or of reverential obedience in to share in like manner the sacrament of the Lord's Supper, under conditions of equally true-hearted devotion, is without doubt the choicest evidence of faith in Jesus Christ in which the Christian of to-day can have part.

How far gone from God the children of Israel were is shown by the fact that the Passover had not been observed as it ought for a long time before the reformation under Hezekiah, and separation from holy living may be measured now all too accurately by the distance that one is found from an humble and eager participation at the table of the Lord.

But as the inward lapse from grace takes place before the outward break from the ceremonial is manifest, so also the inner restoration begins before the outward confession is made. The heart is the forerunner away from God, and it can return to him more easily than the habits in which sin has clothed itself can be corrected.

That is only another way of saying that it is easier to do than it is to undo. The people were ready in heart for a return to the observance of the Passover, with all its precious, stimulating recollection and exalted teaching, before they were ceremonially fit. Outward uncleanness was still upon them. And it is outward uncleanness—the mark of vice, the bite of passion, the habit of iniquity—that often long prevents a soul from the enjoyment of a Christian privilege for which the spiritually hungry heart craves.

Hezekiah, under such circumstances, prayed forgiveness for the outward uncleanness and trusted God to receive the people because of their inward desire. And we believe that the king was justified in his confidence. "The Lord looketh on the heart"

But let no one justify his presumption, by the same token. The outward must measure up to the inward. Give it time, and it always does come. Heart-Christianity does not belong to finger-tip skin. "As a man thinketh in his heart, so is he," even to the finger-tips. When he thinks reverentially he will seek reverential forms, in which to express his thinking. When despising formality do not make the mistake of despising forms.

Reformations and revivals are always times of gladness. The world is on the hunt for the joyous, but joy will only live with duty. Happiness takes flight when duty is slain. Jesus
