WIRELESS MESSAGES

Sent by Marconi Across the Atlantic

HE TELLS THE STORY

Signal Sent from Cornwall to Newfoundland.—Distance 1,700 Miles.

MESSAGES ACROSS THE ATLANTIC.
St. JOHN'S, Nfld., Dec. 14.—Signor Marconi informs a correspondent of the Associated Press that he has received wireless messages from a station in Cornwall, England, solving the problem of signaling across the Atlantic ocean without wires.

MARCONI TELLS THE STORY.
Signor Marconi announces tonight the most wonderful scientific experiment of modern times, in stating that he had received electric signals across the Atlantic ocean from his station in Cornwall, England.

RAILWAY ACCIDENT

Fatal Head-end Collision in Illinois.

11 DEAD 11 INJURED.

Freight Train Plunges Through Bridge—Schooner Lost With All Hands.

DREADEFUL RAILWAY COLLISION.
ROCKFORD, Ill., Dec. 15.—Failure on the part of a conductor to obey orders is supposed to have been the cause of a head-end collision on the Illinois Central between Irene and Perryville this morning. The two trains were the eastbound passenger train and through freight from Chicago, going west. As a result eight people are dead or missing and eleven injured.

BRIDGE GAVE WAY UNDER TRAIN.
WILLIAMSPORT, Pa. Dec. 15.—A freight on the Philadelphia & Erie division of the Pennsylvania Railroad went through the bridge spanning Lycoming creek between this city and Newberry at 6 o'clock this morning. Three lives were lost.

SCHOONER LOST WITH ALL HANDS.
GLOUCESTER, Mass., Dec. 14.—Foundered at sea, a victim of the recent terrible storms which have raged in the North Atlantic, the schooner Iolanthe, with her captain, Julius Olsen, a Norwegian and her crew of 15 men, mostly foreigners is believed to have gone down.

That He Still Has 24,000 Armed Men.

MORTALITY IN CAMPS.

A Terrible Death Rate—Some Important Captures Are Reported.

CONCENTRATION CAMPS.
LONDON, Dec. 14.—The blue book, this morning, shows 3,156 deaths of whites in October, of which number 2,633 were children and 2,807 deaths of whites in November. Of these 2,371 were children. This makes the total number of deaths for the last six months 13,941 or a death rate approximating 233 per year per 1,000. Among the colored persons there were 1,368 deaths in two months.

GEN. DARTNELL'S WORK.
BLOEMFONTEIN, Dec. 14.—General Dartnell has lately been active in the Harrismith district. By a series of night surprises at farm-houses he has captured 24 Boers who were in bed at the time.

AN IMPORTANT CAPTURE.
LONDON, Dec. 16.—Advices received at the war office from Lord Kitchener from Pretoria, reports the important capture of Commandant Badenhorst with a party of Boers, at Sterkfontein.

BOTHA'S REPORTED NUMBERS.
PARIS, Dec. 16.—A morning paper here asserts that Commandant General Botha has reported to Mr. Kruger that he has 24,000 armed men, 10,000 being Cape Colony recruits.

ANOTHER DREADEFUL AFFAIR

A Young Man Leaves His Home in French River and Never Returns. His Charred Remains Found.

Yesterday morning THE GUARDIAN received a telephone message from Lower Montague stating that a dreadful accident occurred on Saturday afternoon at about two o'clock. Mr. Lawrence Kieley left his home in French Creek to go shooting in Lower Montague and in the evening as he did not return home some anxiety was felt. On Sunday morning a search party was organized. After being in the woods for some time one of the party came upon the lifeless body of the unfortunate young man. It appeared from the nature of the wound that Kieley's gun had discharged as the load had entered the unfortunate young man's jaw. The flash which then occurred doubtless ignited the powder which he carried in a bag and when it exploded it burned the clothes off the body, leaving it in a dreadfully charred condition. The unfortunate fellow was about 25 years of age and was the only support of a widowed mother who is heartbroken. It was decided in view of the condition of the body, that immediate interment was necessary and consequently the remains were laid to rest on Sunday afternoon.

The bent fingers as if in the attitude of placing a new cap on the gun, added color to the theory. The paper wadding set fire to the clothing and the explosion of the powder flask in his pocket aided to the terrible work of combustion.

Another account of the accident is as follows:
About seven o'clock on Sunday morning the searchers were horrified to find the lifeless remains in the woods on George Wright's farm, about a mile from home. A dog belonging to John Jeffrey warned the party by barking of the discovery. The body was face upwards with the empty gun, an old fashioned single muzzle loader, and four rabbits which deceased had shot, lying close at hand. One side of the head was completely blown away, and every particle of clothing, excepting a portion of underclothing on the back, had been burnt off, down to the tops of the boots.

The flesh was a charred mass, burned in some places half an inch deep, and the features disfigured beyond semblance of human shape. It is thought that he had aimed at game and that the gun hung fire. Resting the butt on the ground with the muzzle towards his face, he had felt in his pocket for a asp, when the gun was discharged the load passing through his neck and face.
