OTTAWA, Sept. 20.—Sir Frederick Borden speaking about the Halifax garrison, the 3rd R. C. R., said that he had no information as to when the regiment was to be disbanded. As to the disposition of the Regiment he said the Government had entered into a contract with them for one year and to give one month's notice and that was all that was to be done. They could not be treated differently from any other employees of the service. The officers would return to the militia.

CHARLOTTETOWN SOAP WORKS.

The exhibit by this Island manufacturer is fully up to the high standard that they have established in previous years. They have a large show of soaps, potash, and an especially attractive feature in a life size horse's head in soap, the work of J. S. Jones. Their special brands of soap are Silver Bar and Royal Oak. Henry Laphorne is in charge.

Occupying a prominent place in the centre of the building, the Wonderful Cheap Men have a large and varied assortment of men and boys' ready made clothing. LEMUEL WINCHESTER

Has a fine specimen of mechanic's work, next to Miller Bros.' display. It is a three cylinder vertical compound marine engine, made by himself. It is the same style as a large engine. It will carry working pressure of 180 lbs., makes 600 revolutions a minute, and the cylindrical dimensions are 4x3 1/2 x 3 1/2 stroke. Mr. Winchester has been seven years during spare time at work on it.

EXPERIMENTAL FARM.

W. Saxby Blair, Horticulturist of the Maritime experimental Farm, Nappan, has a most attractive booth just inside the north end of the main building which consists of the general crops from that institution shown in straw and also in bottles. This is a combination of the artistic and the educational the whole being neatly gotten up. It is only fair to say that the potatoes shown are not comparable with the main exhibits before the St. John show and also put on display at Halifax. The tests made at the Experimental Farm, are not merely for the purpose of showing what are suitable varieties, but also those that are unsuitable. The sample of Spitz wheat for instance is not suitable for growth in the Maritime Provinces. It is valuable for stock feeding only and oats will be a better grain for this purpose. An interesting feature is the exhibit of Minnesota wheats from the varieties developed at their experimental station on the wheat breeding experiments. Farmers would do well to study this exhibit carefully, comparing these new varieties with some of the standard sorts. Only in this way will the educational benefits be secured. It is also of oats a show. The Early Bluegrass is one of the leaders, and very early, and of great value for mixing with barley and peas. There are 100 varieties of fruits, and it would be well to compare these with our Island produce.

We have not advanced the price of our tobacco. Amber smoking tobacco, Bobs, Currency and Fair Play chewing tobaccos are the same size and price to the consumer as formerly. We have also extended the time for the redemption of Snowshoe Tags to January 1st, 1904.
