—WELL KNOWN HERE — Matthew Tennant, city auditor, died at his home in Fredericton, N. B., shortly after four o'clock Saturday afternoon. The deceased was aged sixty-nine years, and is survived by a widow and four children—two sons and two daughters. The funeral took place Monday afternoon under Masonic auspices. The deceased had been in failing health for some time, but became confined to his home about a fortnight ago. He was a native of St. John but came to Fredericton when a young man and entered the dry goods business with which he was connected until recently. During the last few years in which he was in that business he was a member of Tennant, Davies & Co., and later of Tennant, Davies & Clark. He was a prominent member of the Masonic order. About two years ago he was appointed auditor of the City of Fredericton and later became secretary of the local patriotic committee. The late Mr. Tennant was well known on the island being a brother of the late Mrs. Jas. R. McKee of Charlottetown, whom he visited frequently.—C.
