**Stock Markets At A Glance**

CHICAGO, April 30 (AP) - Active grain futures contracts moved higher in a finishing rally today. During the greater part of the session May rye and the deferred contracts for oats were pressed, following an opening decline of five cents in Minneapolis rye, the 45 and 46 cent.

WINNIPEG, April 30 - (CP) - Rye prices rallied from early hesitation on the Winnipeg Grain Exchange today to post a closing range of five to 1-4 cents a bushel higher.

MONTRÉAL, April 30 - (CP) - After display of firmness in early deals during which a number of issues moved into higher ground, prices turned heavy on average today on the stock exchange and curb market. At the bell all pivotal groups in the indices were lower, with the 100-point composite advanced 3 of a point and a net gain of 1.9 points.

NEW YORK, April 30 - (AP) - Special issues exhibited strength in today's stock market while leaders again lacked rising vigor. The Associated Press 60-stock composite advanced 3 of a point and a net gain of 1.9 points.

Canadian stocks were mixed at close. Dome and Barrick miner stocks were down 1-4. Distillers Seagrams gained as much and Canadian Pacific 1-8. Lake Shore on 1-4.

TORONTO, April 30 - (CP) - The gold stocks perked up in today's Toronto Exchange market to net an index gain of better than a half-point but other groups were down narrowly at the close.

**NOTICE HIGHWAY TRAFFIC ACT**

Commencing Wednesday, May 1, 1946, traffic on the CHARLOTTETOWN - BORDEN, CHARLOTTETOWN - TIGNISH, and CHARLOTTETOWN - RUSTICO paved highways will be open to motor vehicles with gross weight (vehicle and load) not in excess of 10,000 lbs.; also traffic on the CHARLOTTETOWN - SOURIS and CHARLOTTETOWN - MONTAGUE paved highways will be open to motor vehicles with gross weight (vehicle and load) not in excess of 12,000 lbs., provided that in no case shall any vehicle, whose gross weight, including load, exceeds 5,000 lbs. proceed at a speed greater than twenty miles per hour.
