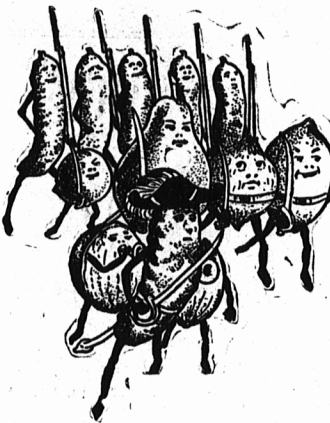

## OFFERS CANADA'S SURPLUS BEEF TO BRITAIN.

**OTTAWA, Oct. 7.**—(Special.)—The dominion government has offered to supply the British war office with the whole Canadian exportable surplus of canned meats and dressed beef during the next six months to be used for army and navy purposes. Prices have been quoted to the war office at a rate which it is hoped will receive a favorable reply. The offer has been made in detail, the negotiations with regard to sending dressed beef are still in an incomplete stage, but if the war office accepts Canada's offer in regard to canned meats it is hoped that similar action will be taken in regard to dressed beef.

If both offers are accepted by the war office there should be a steady demand for meat supplies from Canada during the next six months at least, and an assured market for all live stock raisers in Canada.

No figures are yet available as to the total amount of canned meats and dressed beef available in Canada. Ex-

ports of canned meats last year ran up to nearly \$2,500,000, while exports of beef totalled early \$2,000,000.

**ATHENS, Oct. 6.**—(Via Paris, Oct. 7.)—British troops began to land yesterday at Saloniki. French troops are disembarking a mile and a half from the town and are being concentrated in a camp, located on ground conceded to Serbia after 1913 upon which to build warehouses. From this point, they are entrained as quickly as possible for Gievelli on the Serbian frontier.

Bulgarians have evacuated all buildings on the coast near Dedeagatch while the forts of that city are being armed with long range guns and mine layers are placing a double line of mines across the port. Dedeagatch is reported to be full of troops officered by Germans from Constantinople.
