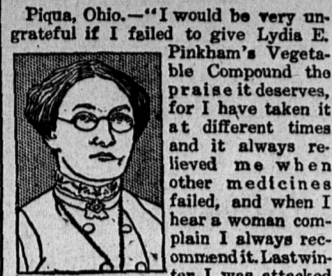

GREAT CROWDS.—About 2,000 people came to Charlottetown by the trains of the P. E. I. R. yesterday. Every available passenger conveyance was put in use for this, one of the largest crowds in years. At the Victoria Hotel last evening there were 275 guests and at the Queen Hotel about 120 people were accommodated; while at the Revere Hotel about 90 people were registered. This does not include any who came in by the late express.

AT THE PRINCE EDWARD.—As a fitting close to a day of entire enjoyment, many visitors attended the Prince Edward Theatre last evening and went away satisfied. The large crowds were admirably handled and the best of order prevailed throughout the splendidly arranged programme. The comedy appealed to all, and roars of laughter greeted each reel, while those of a more serious nature held the closest attention, and everyone left wanting to come again. The large delightful hall was cool and comfortable throughout the entire show.

TEACHERS' CONVENTION.—The annual Teachers' Convention opened in Charlottetown yesterday morning with an exceptionally large attendance. The opening hours were principally taken up with the President, Mr. Crockett's address, the enrolling of teachers and a report by Messrs Curtis, Cain and Seaman on the recent Educational Convention in Halifax. The Convention opens this morning at nine o'clock, and a most instructive and interesting morning's work is anticipated.

TWO-NIGHTS MEETING.—The public meeting of the Annual Convention of the Provincial Teachers' Association takes place this evening (Thursday) in the Prince of Wales College Assembly Hall, at 8 p.m. President F. H. Sexton, Ph.D., of the Technical College, Halifax, will address the meeting on "The Modern Problem of Rural Education." Premier Matheson will also address the meeting, and Justice Fitzgerald will give a patriotic address. The entertainment will consist of music, vocal and instrumental, and readings. The public are invited to attend. The meeting opens at 8 p.m., and not 8.30 p.m. as the programme shows.

CLEVER CAPTURE OF GERMAN RESERVES

Young Officer of H. M. S. Essex Sailed on Monserrat and Signaled Cruiser

OTTAWA, Sept. 23.—A young naval officer belonging to H. M. S. Essex, it is reported to Ottawa, was responsible for the clever capture of 68 German reservists who are now in Halifax. The Monserrat, a Spanish steamer, left New York recently to cross the Atlantic. Just before she sailed an officer of the Essex, who happened to be in New York, was advised that it would be worth his while to get on board that vessel. He took out a passage and boarded her. He found sixty-eight German reservists on the ship. When the Monserrat was beyond the three-mile limit H. M. S. Glory was sighted and the Essex officer got into the bows of the Monserrat and began to signal with his arms to the British cruiser. When the Germans realized what he was doing, they seized him, but it was too late, for the lookout on the Glory had observed him. The Monserrat was held up, a British crew put on board, and the Glory conveyed her into Halifax harbor. The German reservists are now in Halifax jail. A curious part of the incident is that some French reservists were also on board; they, however, have been sent on their way.
