ZULUS GETTING READY FOR WAR

LONDON, February 25.—The mysterious fall in the prices of nearly all the South African shares in the stock market is attributed to secret reports from Natal that the Zulus are about to take the warpath.

For several weeks there have come rumors from South Africa that the native discontent is manifesting itself among many of the tribes, and that it is due to the fact that while the hut taxes have been raised the blacks have been practically barred from the mines, which now employ only Chinese.

Dinizulu, the leader of the Zulus, and son of the famous chieflets Cetewayo, has been erecting military armaments for months, and has been able to secure tons of ammunition and thousands of guns. He was educated while a prisoner at St. Helena, and has made alliances with almost every tribe south of the Zambesi, including the powerful and never-conquered Basutos. There are five million blacks in South Africa, and Dinizulu has been preaching the gospel of an "Africa for the blacks only" ever since he returned to his people, eight years ago.



PRAY FOR A METEORITE.

PORTLAND, ORE., Feb. 24.—The famous Williamette Meteorite has been sold to a New York scientist, who will present it to the American Museum of Natural History in New York city. The price paid was \$20,000, which is said to be the highest price ever given for a meteorite.

The huge mass of ore is one of the best specimens of meteorite ever discovered, weighing about 15 tons. It was found near the banks of the Tualatin River in Clatsop county, Oregon. After its discovery it was the object of much litigation between those who claimed to have found it.
