Expediency is at once the strength and the weakness of our political system. It would have been lawful many moons ago to fill the Prince Edward Island vacancy in the Senate but, evidently it has not yet become expedient, and because of this expediency, Prince Edward Island is deprived of what ever benefits should accrue to it by reason of its constitutional right to representation in the Senate.

ing they will pay more heed to the lesson than to the politicians. The wave of tariff reduction opinion has been gradually rising in the United States and the carrying out of the policy will be watched with interest in Canada.

President Taft's campaign was directed mainly to the upholding of the protective tariff idea with emphasis on the fact that if prosperity is to continue the Republican party must remain in power.

Colonel Roosevelt campaigned on the human interest and social justice features of the Progressive platform, his remedy for the trusts being regulation by a national commission, rather than dissolution. He was a tariff protectionist throughout although favoring reduction in some of the present rates.

During the campaign President Taft and Colonel Roosevelt engaged in bitter controversy which helped neither and it is quite probable that the bullet of the would-be-assassin did more for Colonel Roosevelt than any of his own personal efforts. The attempt upon his life and his gamey recovery elicited much sympathy for him, and doubtless secured him some support which otherwise might have been withheld.

With the result of the election Canada has no cause to be dissatisfied. Mr. Wilson is the type of man who will win the respect of friends and opponents and under his presidency there is no reason to doubt that the friendly and cordial relations between Canada and her powerful neighbor will not only be maintained but strengthened.

UNITED STATES ELECTION.

The election of Woodrow Wilson to the presidency of the United States has caused little if any surprise either in the United States or in Canada. In a three-cornered fight the chances are two to one in favor of the old man and in this case Woodrow Wilson was the odd man.

In Canada generally there will be no dissatisfaction with the result of the election. Wilson is an exceptionally clean man and a man of marked ability. His past history has been associated with learning rather than with politics he having been President of Princeton University for many years. It was only in 1910 that he entered the political arena when he was elected governor of the State of New Jersey. Since his nomination for the presidency in June last his prospects for election were generally regarded as almost absolutely safe and throughout the campaign nothing occurred to dim the prospect but rather the reverse. The bitter and personal war between his two opponents, Taft and Roosevelt, strengthened the assurance of his election.

Mr. Wilson made his campaign on tariff reduction and opposition to the trusts, holding to the doctrine that the trusts must be made to obey the law, that competition must be restored and that monopolies must be broken up.

The doctrine of tariff reduction is gaining ground everywhere. It has become associated in the public mind with excessive prices and the high cost of living. The world is gradually returning to the doctrine of tariff for revenue only and will some day reach it. The return is being delayed by the misrepresentations of the politicians but when the people have paid the price for the lessons they are learning.
