NEW YORK CITY BUYING BUTTER IN MANY LANDS

NEW YORK, Dec. 12.—New York City, which loves butter more than any other city in the world, is eating so much butter that the domestic supply is inadequate. Large quantities of butter are being shipped to this city from Denmark, Holland and also from Canada. One of the biggest wholesale dealers in the city closed a contract last week for the importation of several tons of creamery butter from New Zealand.

The entire lot will be shipped direct from New Zealand to New York.

GIVEN NOBEL PRIZE FOR FAMINE RELIEF

CHRISTIANA, Norway, Dec. 11.—The Nobel peace prize today was presented Dr. Fridtjof Nansen in the presence of King Haakon, Crown Prince Olaf, the Prime Minister and cabinet officials. The award was made for Dr. Nansen's work in relieving the starving populations of Russia and Asia Minor on behalf of the League of Nations and for his endeavors to promote a brotherhood of nations.

EUROPE'S WHEAT NEEDS ABOUT 640,000,000 BUSHELS

WASHINGTON, Dec. 12.—European requirements for wheat during the current year will aggregate about 640,000,000 bushels, according to cable advices today to the United States department of commerce. Eastern European states will supply about 3 percent of the needs of the continent it was stated. Before the war they supplied about 40 percent of the requirements.

MUST FURNISH PROOF OF SUFFICIENT EXPULSION

WINNIPEG, Dec. 12.—At a meeting of the Manitoba Hockey Association here last night, permission was granted the Fort William and Port Arthur Clubs to play exhibition games with the Eveleth, Minn., and Sault Ste. Marie, Mich. teams.

Charges made recently by the Winnipeg Senior Amateur Hockey League alleging semi-professionalism in the ranks of the Manitoba Amateur organization resulted in the Manitoba Association requesting the Winnipeg League officials to substantiate the charges. Failing this the Winnipeg League may be expelled from the Association.

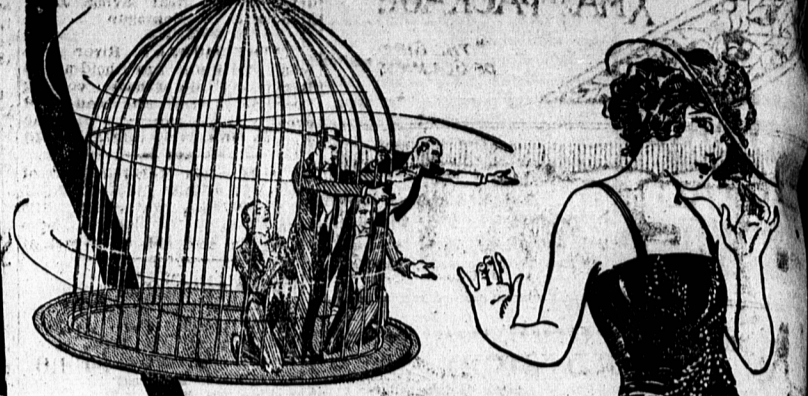
