

# P.E. Island Horses Win Two Victories

## SPORTING NEWS

### Cape Breton Entry Is Other Winner At Old Home Week Program

Island-owned horses chalked up two victories yesterday as the Old Home Week racing programme got underway with the other victory being chalked up by a Sydney-owned horse. Lady Rose, driven by Rankine McLaine came through with a straight heat victory in the three-year-old futurity; Jean Henley provided a minor upset as, piloted by Willard Kelly she paced off with the 2:16 Trot and Pace over a field of twelve while Coronation McKillop handled by Mike Jabalee, won the 2:22 Trot, also in straight heats.

Brilliant sunshine after days of unsettled weather greeted the racing program and a big opening day crowd saw battles in each and every heat of the one raced. The three winners had comparatively easy victories but making up for this were the battles staged between the rest of the fields for positions. In every heat second, third and fourth places were only decided by an eyelash as stretch drives continued right to the wire and it was a difficult job for the judges to place them after the winner had flashed by the stands, the second trip around.

#### Drivers Thrown

Three drivers were thrown during the afternoon but in each instance the drivers escaped unhurt. The first of these took place in the first heat of the 2:16 Trot and Pace, driver like Moreside being pitched off, Major Bowes completing a mile guileless before being stopped. The Major however went on to race the three heats and furnish stiff competition, especially in the first mile. Driver James Arbing was unseated from behind Christie Budlong on the second turn of the first half in the first heat of the 2:22 while H. Harrison was also thrown to the ground while scoring Jolly Harvester who went down also.

The program was delayed due to broken harness, thrown shoes and damaged bikes but outside of these unavoidable holdups the entire program was run off smoothly and efficiently by the capable officials in the stand.

Today four classes are on the card and with promise of a very fast track fast times, blanket finishes and upsets are fully expected by what is likely to be the largest crowd ever to witness a harness meeting here.

The races will get away at 2 p.m. sharp.

#### 3-YEAR-OLD FUTURITY
