

—The schooner J. B. Martin loaded with produce by Joseph Read and Company, Summerside, sailed yesterday for St. Johns, Newfoundland.

—Last week Rev. E. S. Weeks, G. W. Pt. S. of T., paid an official visit to Highland Division, Heartsville, and installed the officers for the current quarter. There was a large attendance and a good time was enjoyed.

—The regular monthly meeting of the Summerside Town Council was held in the Council Chamber last night. Mayor Compton, and all the Councillors, except Coun. Arsenault, were present. A bill to the amount of \$1776.16c., was read and ordered to be paid. A communication from the board of Underwriters was read and referred to the chief of the fire department for report. The chief of the fire department, James A. McNeill, addressed the council re-organizing the fire department. Several resolutions from the fire department were presented to the Council, and were referred to the chief and captain of different companies for action. The matter of the purchase of a hose reel, etc. for the fire department was also read to the chief and captains. The clerk was ordered to notify the Sun Electric Company that the light in the engine room and town stable was no longer needed. Considerable discussion took place in reference to the sale of the town horses. It was decided to call for tenders for the service of a team of horses such times as when needed for work on the streets. After considerable discussion James Millman was appointed second street man after which the council adjourned.
