There were five expeditions engaged in the race for the south pole. Scott, British; Amundsen, Norwegian; Filchner, German; Shiraz, Japanese; and Manson, Australian. Scott started from New Zealand in November, 1910.

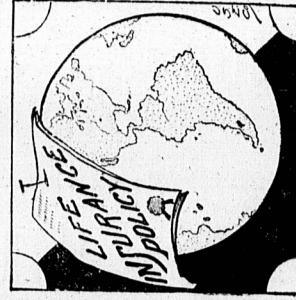
