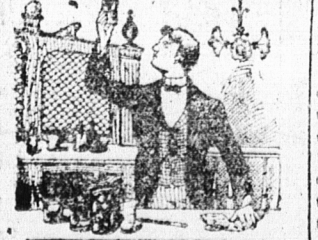

DEATH BY DROWNING.

There is an appalling loss of life by drowning from year to year in Canada. In the early spring when the ice which formed the winter roads and bridges over lake and stream becomes weakened by the sun, there are always some who are engulfed in the waters. Later comes the boating and bathing season, and scores in quest of health and pleasure meet untimely death beneath the waters. Again when the cold season comes on adventurous skaters venture on the ice before it is strong enough to bear and pay the penalty.

The lives thus sacrificed are mostly those of the young and vigorous, those to whom life holds most of value, and at the same time those whose lives are of most value to the state. The thought has occurred to many. Cannot something be done to prevent these tragedies which thus attend upon our water sports and pastimes? Our correspondent, Canmore, devotes a short letter to one branch of this wide subject.

His proposition is that all who go forth in boats or canoes should be compelled by law to take life belts with them, these preservers to be supplied on application by the Government fish warden. We fear this is not a practicable proposition, however excellent the motive that prompts it. And yet the law compels all passenger steamers to be equipped with a sufficient number of life preservers, while more persons are yearly drowned from accidents to small pleasure craft than from all the passenger steamers on our inland waters.

Something ought to be done to prevent as far as possible the losses of life by boating and bathing accidents, and of fishermen in plying their perilous calling. Bathers who cannot swim and get beyond their depth, bathers who can swim but are attacked by cramps, would in scores of cases be saved if they wore a light life belt sufficient to keep the body afloat. It seems strange that this obvious precaution is so much neglected, is in fact almost never thought of. The multiplication of motor boats with self-taught operators adds to the dangers of boating. It may be that legislation along the lines suggested by our correspondent would be a good thing. And with or without it there should be a campaign of education as to the value of the life belt.

KENT STREET SIDEWALK.

On general principles sidewalks on straight streets should be laid in straight lines. Also in business sections it is obvious that the footway, should be laid as close as may be to the fronts of stores, hotels, shops and offices, as is done on Water, Queen, Richmond, Grafton and other business streets. This latter contention is accentuated by those doing business on the north side of Kent Street, between Great George and Queen. Unfortunately, if they are to have their way, the walk in front of their premises will be five feet or more out of line with its continuation east of Great George and west of Queen as now laid down. We do not regard such deviation as very serious so long as the walk is straight across the entire front of the block. This portion of Kent is very much thronged with teams on market

days, really requiring more width of street than at present exists to prevent being at times blockaded. This fact, with the obvious requirements of close access by teams to the front of business places, the exigencies of snow drift in winter and the fact that owners are obliged to pay half the cost of the walks in front of their properties, seems to make a strong and exceptional case in this instance.

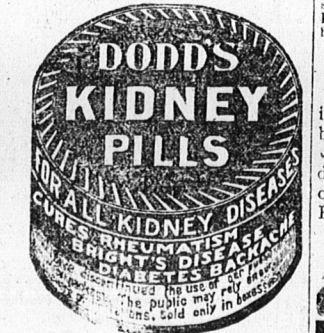
THE COMING MARCONI SERVICE

By the middle of September, or one month hence, the people of Canada are promised direct wireless telegraph service across the Atlantic between Cape Breton and Ireland. The difficulties of transmission over this great distance are believed to be successfully overcome, and for weeks past the actual transmission of messages has been going on.

One of the difficulties for a time was the sun's rays. It required three or four times the battery power to send signals across the ocean by day that was required at night. We are not told how this has been obviated, but it is given out that the system is now working all right both day and night without trouble. The rates settled upon are 10 cents per word for private messages and half those rates for press messages. To these must be added the charges over the land lines. It is earnestly to be hoped that this time there may be no further postponement and that the trans-Atlantic wireless system will go into operation for actual business.

The value of a good hay day like yesterday will be realized by farmers at its full worth. The haying season has so far been a rather critical one.

British trade is booming quite as much as Canadian trade and more, the exports for July being \$35,000,000 in excess of the like month last year. There's life in the Old Land yet.

EDITOR'S MAIL

TO SAVE FROM DROWNING.

SIR,—I have often thought something should be done to prevent the terrible loss of life that takes place yearly in Canadian waters through the upsetting of sail boats, canoes, etc. I think the Dominion Government should be moved to enact a law, that would compel all occupants of boats, canoes, etc. to be supplied with life belts by which in case of accident any persons thrown in the water would have a chance to save their lives until rescued from their perilous position. These life belts or preservers could be supplied by the Government fish warden in the same way as fishing license are issued. I feel this would be a wise move for our law-makers to take. Trusting others will give their views on this matter I close.
