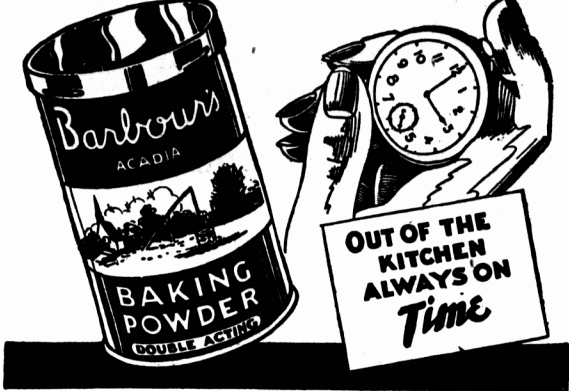

Marking Linen
When using indelible ink for marking linen, or clothing of any kind, stretch the material in embroidery hoops. The work will be done better as this gives a firm, smooth surface on which to work.

Starch
If starch is left over, pour it into a glass jar and cover with a lid. Place the jar in the refrigerator and when ready to use dilute with boiling water.

Renewing Old Lace
Squeeze the old lace in hot, soapy water, then in cold water, then in milk to stiffen it. Press it on the wrong side.

Cook's Corner

SHEPHERD SOUFFLE

1 cup left-over meat
1 teaspoon minced onion
2 tablespoons fat
2 half-inch slices of soft bread
1 1/3 cups hot milk
2 eggs
1/2 teaspoon salt
1/4 teaspoon paprika
1 cup thinly sliced cheese
1 tablespoon fat
1 tablespoon minced parsley.

Put meat and onion through grinder. Pan fry for 3 minutes with the two tablespoons fat. Break bread into small pieces. Cut cheese into 1/2 inch slices. Combine bread, cheese, beaten egg yolks and hot milk. Add remaining fat, parsley, salt and paprika. Let stand 30 minutes or until ready to bake. Then fold in stiffly beaten egg whites. Pour into baking dish over meat. Oven preheated in moderate oven, 350 deg. F. until set—about 45 minutes. Serves 4 to 5.

TOPSY-TURVY CASSEROLE

1 1/2 cups cooked, diced potatoes
1 cup cooked, diced carrots
1 cup chopped raw celery
1 1/2 cups ground cooked meat
2 tablespoons milk-flavoured fat
2 cups canned tomatoes
1/2 teaspoon salt

Mix ingredients together and turn them into greased baking dish. Bake in a moderately hot oven, 375 deg. F. for 30 minutes. Serves 6.

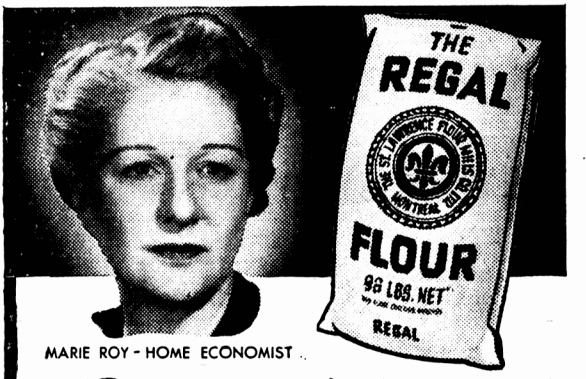
