

Canadiens Win 3-1 From Red Wings, Send Series Into Seventh Game

MONTREAL, April 3 — (CP) — Montreal Canadiens called on all their courage and razzle dazzle Saturday night to hang a 3-1 defeat on Detroit Red Wings and send their Stanley Cup semi-final into the seventh and deciding game.

A crowd of 11,226 watched Canadiens turn in their most brilliant display of the series.

All goals came in a hectic outburst in the second period, and the hero mantle again fell to Gerry Flamonson. The left-winger rifled in two goals and almost equalled his three-goal hat trick that won the second game.

Maurice Richard, playing a strong two-way game, scored on a typical Richard exhibition. Gordie Howe, who has become Mr. Polson to Canadiens in this series, scored the Wings' lone goal, his seventh of the playoff.

Although Canadiens suffered six of the 10 penalties, they made better use of man-power advantage. Flamonson's first goal came while the teams were all even, but then Richard and Flamonson struck swiftly for two more while Nels Podolsky of the Wings was sitting out a cross-check penalty.

Howe scored while Canadiens were short-handed two men. Throughout three periods of spectacular drives, close checking behind the blue lines and rugged, bouncing body-checks, the master-minding played no small part.

Detroit Bewildered

Coach Dick Irvin of Canadiens shuffled and re-shuffled his forward lines in a bewildering pattern Saturday night, but coach Tommy Ivan of the Wings wondering what was coming next. He admitted his dilemma after the game.

Floyd Curry, right-winger brought up from Buffalo for the series, made his debut. At centre on the same starting line was Murdo MacKay, another Buffalo farmhand. Rip Riepelle was on left wing.

Richard shifted from right wing to centre on a line with Flamonson and Joe Carveth and then returned to his usual right wing job teamed with Ken Mosdell and Bob Millon.

Periodically Norm Dussault was tossed out on left wing, with Billy Reay at centre and Carveth on right wing.

Ivan stuck with his regular threesome, and again his most

potent and threatening line was Sid Abel, Gordie Howe and Ted Lindsay.

It was Howe's misfortune to take the sting out of the Wings' third-period drive for goals. The big Detroit ring-winger drew a major penalty when his stick out Ken Reardon on the side of the head. Goalsie Harry Lumley drew a discomfiting penalty in the first period for heaving the puck out of the rink.

His retirement ends a career in which he became one of the greatest centres in the game. His clever play-making and competitive spirit always were an inspiration to his mates.

Toronto Marlboros In 5-3 Victory Over Sydney In Allan Cup Play

TORONTO, April 3 — (CP) — Bill (Red) Johnson Saturday night fired Toronto Marlboros to a 5-3 victory over Sydney Millionaires in the best-of-five Eastern Canada senior hockey semi-final series. The opening game last Wednesday ended in a 1-1 draw. The third game will be played here Monday night.

A Maple Leaf Garden crowd of 13,266 fans watched the 21-year-old red-head, who played with the Memorial Cup champion Port Arthur Bruins last season, share in all Marlboro goals. He scored two and helped set up Al Buchanan for a pair and Chuck Blair for another.

For Millionaires, Cliff Roach, Johnny Arundel and Don (Red) McRae were the marksmen.

The wide-open game was decided only in the final period when Johnson broke a 3-3 tie with a goal for the Marlboros at 4:16, mainly on a defensive lapse by Millionaires. The red-head then combined with Blair to help set up Buchanan for the clincher at 10:15 after Sydney missed several good chances for the equalizer.

Johnson showed himself a brilliant opportunist in bagging the tie-breaker. Besepectable Doug Fritz, hard-working Sydney defenceman, passed the puck on Johnson's stick to one side of the Sydney goal and Red worked out in front, then beat goalie Jack Gibson cleanly.

The game was nip-and-tuck then. Sydney scored the opening goal only to see it tied up 1-1 before the first period ended. Then Blair gave Marlboros a 2-1 lead at the second frame. Roach got that goal back, but Buchanan put Toronto ahead 3-2 before the second stanza finished.

Buchanan's goal, his first of two, also came on a defensive lapse by Millionaires. Johnson passed the puck into the Sydney zone. Joe Watts, Millionaires defenceman, seemed to be nearest to retrieving it but Buchanan swooped in and reached it first. He then beat Gibson with a backhand.

McRae's tally, tying the score at 3-3 at 2:15 of the third period, was the picture goal of the night. The lanky right-winger, who played with Winnipeg's Memorial Cup Monarchs in 1946, split the Marlboros defence and stickkanded the puck past reminder Howie Harvey.

After Johnson put Toronto ahead to stay two minutes later, the Millionaires kept up constant attacks on the Marlboros goal but it was Toronto who got the next goal — by Buchanan.

With less than two minutes remaining, a Sydney gangling at-

back forced the puck into the net but the referees called the goal back, ruling Maurice Dowling lifted his stick above waist height to bang the puck home from the air.

Marlboros Use Juniors Before the game, Sydney was advised it was in order for the Marlboros to use three players from their eliminated junior team — forwards Lorne Pirie and George Armstrong and defenceman Hugh Bolton. W. A. Hewitt, Canadian Amateur Hockey Association registrar, made the ruling after Dr. C. A. MacDonald, Sydney club president, questioned their status. Bolton and Pirie both played for the Toronto Hockey Association senior champions in the series opener, but Armstrong replaced Pirie Saturday night.
