IMPROVED FARMING

A Visit To Mr. D. C. McKinley's Farm

HIS EXCELLENT STOCK

Touched Upon and his Success as a Farmer and Stock Raiser.

In the Island press it is just possible that the successful "Islander abroad" may be dwelt upon at too great a length to the disparagement of those who remain and are successful at home. Believing this to be true the remarks that will follow are launched with the confident belief that the article will accomplish a mission of usefulness and possibly instill in the mind of a reader that a farmer's home in Prince Edward Island is not to be thoughtlessly exchanged for the enchantment of a distant clime.

In consequence of Mr. D. C. McKinley's experience in the art of handling, improving, breeding, care and management of high grade stock a GUARDIAN representative visited his farm last Saturday afternoon. As a great many are aware Mr. McKinley's farm consisting of 130 acres, is situated at Franklin Point on the North River, eight miles from the city, but in the winter time the Capital can be reached in one and one half miles, making it very convenient. In passing it might be noticed that the placing of the bridge at or near Brighton would be a great advantage and would shorten the distance to the city very much. In company with Mr. McKinley the writer was permitted to visit the stables of the farm and see exactly what kind of animals were kept on hand. He soon learned that Shorthorns were in favor with the proprietor and that many of the animals were bred for flesh and of course in such animals the meat is the essential thing and also that it be laid on in the prime parts. In looking over the lot the writer was impressed with the type of Shorthorns and many of the animals in all their attributes, certainly have but little to be desired as beef makers. A few of the best are given below: The first animal shown was Glamus Beauty, a pure bred cow, six years old from Beedle, imported in dam by Hon. John Dryden. Dam by Lord Glamus, another importation made by Hon. John Dryden. Three of her full sisters have taken first and second prizes at the Toronto exhibition. She has a promising bull calf at foot a few days old sired by Royal Sirius, a pure bred Crookshank. Glamus Beauty is noted for being a good breeder, early maturity and her offspring are conspicuous for their aptitude to fatten as well as excellent milkers.

The second animal shown was of Challenger stock and an excellent stock getter. Her offspring are very taking and good prices have been realized.
May Fern by Gay Lad is also a beautiful animal and is an excellent stock getter. A number of her calves have been shipped to the neighboring Provinces and wherever they have gone renewed orders have been received.
Glamus II is almost an exact reproduction of her mother Glamus Beauty.
Blanche, a beautiful pure bred animal, dam Glamus Beauty, sired by King James the sire of the bull exhibited at the Provincial exhibition by Mr. Archibald, of Truro.

In another department were several heifers, a number of which were pure bred. Among the number was Rose of Sharon, imported from Ontario, sired by imported Prime Minister. The heifer's dam was sired by imported Guardsman, the sire of the bull which secured the gold medal at the World's Fair and he in turn sired the Sweepstakes bull of the United States for six years.

In a separate compartment were five bulls. The first shown was General Bob,

an excellent bull sired by Royal Sirius, dam Glamus Beauty. The animal is very large for his age, only one year old in May. Another named Strathcona, sired by Royal Sirius, dam Evangeline, is an interesting youngster and will doubtless render a favorable account of himself. The remainder of the number the writer was told were nearly all pure bred.

The next animal seen was Clementa, a two-year-old with calf at foot. This animal was imported by Mr. McKinley during the winter, and was with calf at the time of purchase, sired by the imported Scotch bred bull, Prince Lewis. The heifer was sired by Guardsman and her dam was by Albert, an imported bull. The animal resembles her sire, Guardsman, very much. Readers are well aware that Guardsman is considered by all as one of the best bulls that ever crossed the Atlantic. The above are only a few of the many excellent animals to be found on the farm.

At present Mr. McKinley is fattening six cattle. One animal which will probably weigh 13 hundred lbs. is only one year and ten months old. Another three-year-old will doubtless tip the scales at 1700 pounds. Both animals have been sold for a handsome sum to Messrs. Saunders & Newsum. The other four will average 11 hundred each.

Another batch of six yearling heifers are well worth seeing. Many are as large as two-year-olds.

Some idea of Mr. McKinley's stock can be ascertained when it is learned that for a yearling heifer he would not take two hundred dollars.

Besides his excellent stock of cattle Mr. McKinley is a pure winner in horse flesh. At the present time he has a number of fine blood horses and fillies which are prize winners.
